A \$4,000,000 Fire at Pittsburg.

The most destructive fire which visited Pittsburg since 1845 broke out about midnight, Saturday, in T. C. Jenkins' wholesale grocery house.

Among the losses are Jenkins' entire grocery block, \$500,000. Joseph Horne & Son, dry goods house, \$1,000,000. Other large business houses were destroyed, namely, Greer & Co's china house; Mayer's glove store; Saamen's carpet house; Huck's cigar factory; Hall Bros. building; Methodist book concern building; the Duquesne theatre and some other buildings.

Hundreds of Lives Lost in a Paris Bazaar Fire.

A fire caused a panic in a Paris bazaar fire on Tuesday. Some 1800 people were in the place and a terrible panic ensued. The strong trampled upon the weak, the young on the old and heart-rending shrieks rose from all sides as the flames swept through and into the struggling masses.

One hundred dead have been found, and it is believed that another hundred are beneath the ruins.

THE WAR IN GREECE.

The Grecian army 12,000 strong, a few days ago defeated the Turks 14,000 strong, killing a great number of the enemy.

The Turks, on the other hand, gained several smaller battles.

Intelligence comes to the effect that Greece is anxious to make peace; also that Greece and Turkey mean to fight it out.

The powers are for intervention to stop the war.

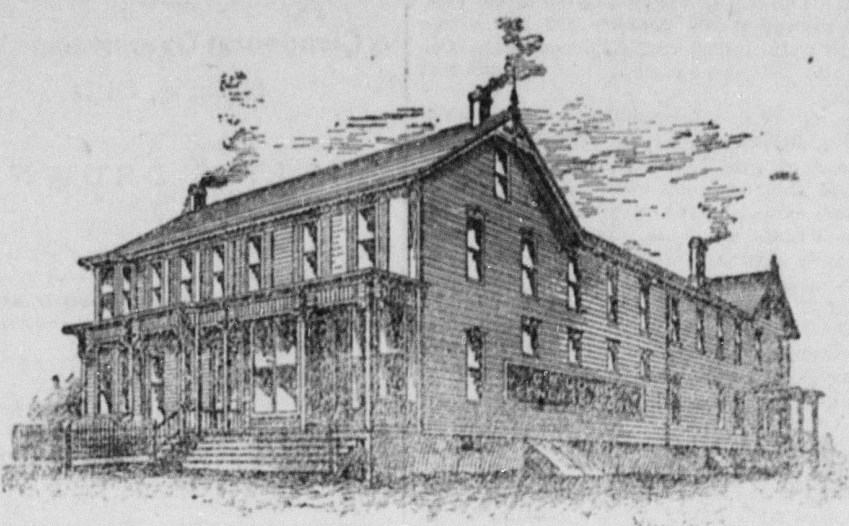
