Jonas Smith, J. J. Jordan and Wm. A. Reiber are students under the instruction of Prof. Calvin Neff.

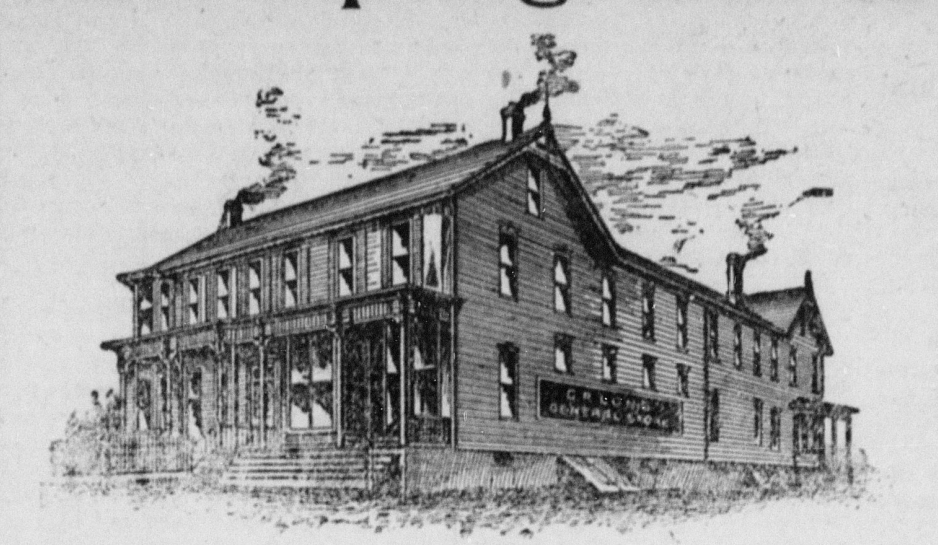
Mrs. Bella Stump visited her daughter, Mrs. Fishburn, at Potters Mills Tuesday.
