WON'T ACCEPT IT.

The Council Refuses to Take the Reservoir Because it Leaks.

There is an evident hitch in the amicable proceedings between the contractor who constructed the boro water plant and the town council over the payment for the work done on the system, and the council refuses to accept the reservoir completed last week because it is unsatisfactory and as they allege, will not hold water.

The reservoir was constructed according to the lines laid down by the members of the council. Its original cost was to be about \$1100. Changes were made in the plans and a further outlay of several hundred dollars was authorized on the hole.

There is an evident difference between the parties also on the mains and ditching. A bill was handed in for the work which the council say has not been done, and want more evidence before the bill is paid.

The failure is attributed to the fact that during the blooming season there was excessive rainfall, which washed the pollen and prevented proper fertilization by insects, while a cold wave added to the injury, and subsequent moist, humid weather was favorable to the development of fungus disease.
