Secretary Long Calls for More Warships. Secretary of the Navy, Long, recommends the following:

Three seagoing sheath and coppered battleships of about 13,500 tons trial displacement, carrying the heaviest armor and most powerful ordnance for vessels of their class, and to have the highest practicable speed and great radius of action.

Three sheathed and coppered protected cruisers of about 6,000 tons displacement. Estimated cost, exclusive of armor and armament, \$2,150,000 each.

Secretary Long also recommends the increase of the enlisted men to 20,000 and of apprentices to 2,500.

PEACE WITH SPAIN

Dons Yield and Accept Our Conditions. The Peace Commission sitting in Paris, has about closed its labors.

The American demands included the acquisition of the whole of the Philippine and Sulu groups for \$20,000,000, and it is also understood the United States will purchase the Caroline islands.

The question of the debt of Cuba was left unsettled, and was to be taken up this week.

Spain in her reply says, she desired to avoid any further disorder, and had concluded to accept the American offer unconditionally and thus bow to the superior power of the victor.

HOW TRUSTS FLOURISH

The New York Herald prints a list of trusts or combines doing business as chartered companies in the United States, with the capitalization of each. The list comprises fifty-one great trusts, including some minor ones in the same line of business as the greater ones, and sixty-four miscellaneous trusts, some of which are really greater in capitalization than most of those in the other category.

The Herald does not mention the tin plate trust, now forming with a capital of \$52,000,000 under the convenient laws of New Jersey, and whose first move, protected by the tariff against foreign competition, will be to advance the price of articles of universal consumption—necessities in every household in the land.

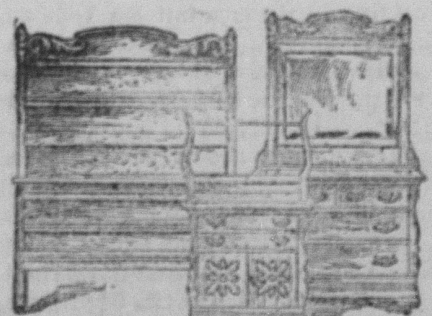
