A GREAT GATHERING.

The Farmers and Pure Butter Men up in Arms against Stone and Hamilton.

The farmers and pure butter men are to have a joint public meeting during the Grange Encampment at Centre Hall, on Thursday, Sept. 20...

The Pure Butter Protective Association will be represented by their attorney, Luther Kauffman, accompanied by a large delegation of representatives including the members of the Produce Exchange of Philadelphia.

The State Grange will be represented by Worthy Master Hill, of Cambria county; Worthy Lecturer Packard, of Bradford county; Worthy Secretary Ailman, of Juniata; Miss Helen Johnson, of Erie county...

Besides these there will be an array of attorneys, newspaper reporters and politicians, to hear the important arguments to be made by the representatives of the State Grange and Pure Butter men.

It is proposed to probe the oleo swindlers and expose their schemes to defraud the farmers of their butter market and the State government of its just revenues.

The State administration, the Secretary of Agriculture, the Dairy and Food Commissioner, with his employees, will be held to an official account for mal-administration of duties.

The farmers are determined to make it a fight to the finish and will demand the Legislature to bring the guilty parties to trial.

The farmers, no doubt, will be out in force as this is a matter of vital interest to their welfare.
