Latest News of Pennsylvania Told in Short Order.

Gow, Pittsburg, apparatus for manufacturing gas, also manufacturing glass drawing machine; Judas C. Herrman, Allegheny, friction draft rigging; Joseph Homola, Allegheny, hose coupling; Thomas L. Howell, Smithfield, railway track gauge; Alexander F. Humphrey, Allegheny, miniature submarine boat; Michael Killen, J. F. Lewis, Bradock, and A. P. Aiken, Port Perry, furnace bottling; John H. King and E. M. Wolfe, Beaver Falls, apparatus for manufacturing seamless tubing; Robert G. Kirkwood, Pittsburg, fluid fuel heater and pumping system, also oil feeding and storing system.

Dashing through flames in a stairway to reach a bedchamber to save his baby while his wife lay burning to death at the bottom of the stairs was the experience of a silk mill foreman, William Schwartz, of Pottsville. It was just before the hour for rising that Mrs. Schwartz started downstairs to get the infant some milk. She dropped the glass kerosene lamp, which exploded, throwing the blazing oil about the stairway. Her husband responded to her screams for assistance. Despite his efforts she was burned from head to foot and is dying at the Pottsville Hospital. Schwartz was also badly burned. While he was extinguishing his wife's blazing garments a plaintive wail from the bedroom reminded him of the infant's danger. The stairs were all ablaze by this time. He broke through the wall of flame and rescued the child.

With the coolness that has characterized him throughout and without a tremor, William Hays, colored murderer, paid the penalty for his crime at Uniontown. The execution was carried out with remarkable celerity, and Hays was pronounced dead in nine and one-half minutes after the drop fell. The crime for which Hays was hanged was the murder of Edward Perkins, colored, at Masontown, November 14, 1902. Hays boarded with Perkins and his attentions to Perkins' wife led to trouble between the two which resulted in Hays killing Perkins. Hays left a message to the public warning all young men against drinking and gambling, the causes which led him to the scaffold.

Forest fires which are raging in the vicinity of Tamaqua and menacing valuable farm properties are doing great damage. Much valuable timber is being destroyed and the flames show no sign of abatement.

The Tyrone Electric Railway Company, of Tyrone; the City Passenger Railway Company, of Altoona, and the Altoona & Logan Valley Electric Railway Company, three Blair county electric railways controlled by the American Street Railway Company, of Philadelphia, have been merged under the name of the Altoona & Logan Valley Electric Railway Company. A mortgage of \$4,000,000 in favor of the Equitable Trust Company, of Philadelphia, was entered against the electric lines of the allied companies.

On the charge of selling blackberry brandy adulterated with tar and a preservative acid, ten persons were arraigned before Justice Conrad at Pottsville and fined \$50 each and the costs. Suits were also brought against five other persons on a similar charge. State Pure Food Commissioner R. M. Simmers has some 250 similar suits to bring. If he has occasion to proceed against the same persons again he says he will ask that the full fine of \$500 to \$1000, fixed by the old law, be imposed.

Isaac Sechrist, of Moore's Mill, on Chickies creek, has been found guilty by a local magistrate of using a fish basket. The charge was preferred by Fish Warden James D. Parker. A fine of \$25 was imposed.

Owen Owens, aged 50, employed as a hewer at a quarry in Penn Argyll, was killed by being struck with a piece of slate that fell from a slate block.

Mentally unbalanced from brooding over religious matters, Mrs. Lizzie Frey, wife of Jesse Frey, of Sharpville, took a large dose of paris green and died.

While Mrs. H. Group, of Idaville, was boiling apple butter over an open fire in her yard, her dress caught fire and she was so badly burned that she died within a few hours.

Within twenty-four hours after his son, Albert Leister, had dropped dead in the postoffice at Gilbertsville, Noah Leister, an aged resident of New Hanover, expired.

Walter, the nine-year-old son of Jefferson Heisey, of Colebrook, was killed instantly by a fall from the third floor of his father's grist mill.

William Mitchell, one of the oldest active boiler-makers in the State, and the oldest employe of Roach's Shipyard, Chester, dropped dead from heart disease.

Kate Higgins, aged 14 years, was taken to the Pottsville jail on a charge of larceny. It is said she had been stealing in a systematic manner for many months. When the home of Miss Mary Koch was searched, over a wagonload of plunder belonging to residents of the town was discovered. The property included chairs, rugs, lamps and other household goods, all of which, it is said, is the girl's stole.

A Lackawanna locomotive ran into a handcar at Gravel Place. F. Stalmack and George Burton were killed and John Frank, G. Reeves, John Lukley Paul Ridos and J. Keif were injured. The men were riding on the handcar. All lived in Stroudsburg.

The thirteenth annual session of the School Directors' Association of Northampton County was held in Easton. Thomas J. Keckline, of Williams Township, president, occupied the chair, and there was a large attendance. Negotiations are on foot for the merger of Western Pennsylvania gas companies.
