

HARTER-LOVE-STONER VS. SHAFFER.

In this issue is published a defense of Mr. Shaffer. In it he states the facts so clearly that comment is unnecessary.

Admission was made by Mr. Stoner to Mr. Zerby, an attorney, that the Gazette's statement was prepared by Harter, and that it contained misrepresentations. These, Mr. Stoner claims, he asked to have out out, but no heed was given Mr. Stoner's instructions.

The sum and substance of the matter briefly told is this:

The Gazette began to realize that Shaffer's election was assured, and to thwart this it attempted to defame the character of Mr. Shaffer. Mr. Stoner had no confidence in Harter, the editor of the Gazette, so Harter was obliged to call on some one of equal capacity, but one who bore a better reputation. Ex-Judge Love was selected, and together they induced Mr. Stoner to sign a statement.

To accomplish this, Miss Olive Snook, a member of the Stoner household, was paid for the interest she took in the matter of securing the statement.

Mr. Stoner acknowledges that he can neither read nor write English, and that he told Harter to publish nothing but the truth. He realized that Harter could easily impose on him.

This is the part of the campaign work Lawyer Love and the Gazette have been doing. It is the dirty work; it best suits their taste; it is the only character of work either of them are capable of performing. Dirty politics.

The Stoner letter has proven a boomerang, and the effects of it are as wide as the stretch of the letter has penetrated, yet it is to be regretted that the Republican party in Centre county have two men who are willing to indulge in politics infinitely worse than boodling.

The better element of the Republican party have discontinued the methods employed by the Gazette and Love, and take no part in it. Furthermore, the foremost attorneys and citizens of Bellefonte, who are out and out Republicans, not only shun the Gazette-Love combination, but will join the Democrats in repudiating their tactics at the polls. They are not worthy of political existence.

The Stoner letter, and its surroundings, make it obligatory upon every voter, Republican or Democrat, who has the least regard for right and decent politics, to vote for Mr. Shaffer for Sheriff. The rebuking of foul methods are of infinitely more importance than the election of a candidate. The only way to rebuke political scavengers is to defeat the candidates they support.

Shaffer Not a Swindler.

A MANLY APPEAL TO THE VOTERS OF CENTRE COUNTY—THE FACTS IN THE LUMBER DEAL CLEARLY AND TRUTHFULLY SET FORTH BY MR. SHAFFER AND MR. HOMAN.

To the Voters of Centre County:

In justice to the confidence reposed in me by my friends in Centre county, which I very highly esteem, and which I have always endeavored to merit, I feel that I should make some reply to the vicious assault upon my private and business character by Mr. Thomas H. Harter in his issue of the Keystone Gazette of October 27th:

In the first place it is manifest from all the data that has been obtained that Mr. Harter is speaking through Mr. John Stoner, and that the entire purpose of the letter ascribed to Mr. Stoner, was to bring about my defeat for the Office of Sheriff. As the facts are very plain and can be thoroughly substantiated, I think it only proper that the public should know the truth concerning the allegations contained in the attempt of Mr. Harter to defame my character and reputation:

Mr. Stoner, Mr. George Homan and myself constituted a Partnership, for the purpose of operating a lumber operation in Bedford county during the year 1902; the entire operation was in the hands of Mr. Homan, because it was impossible at that time for me, on account of the long illness and subsequent death of my wife, to give the matter my personal attention; that all of the business of the firm was conducted by Mr. Homan. Not a dollar of the funds used in this operation passed through my hands, not a check was drawn by me, no obligations of any kind were given by me, and as stated before, I was entrusting everything to Mr. Stoner and Mr. Homan.

Unfortunately for me, Mr. Homan confessed judgments against the firm of Homan & Shaffer, without my knowledge or consent; and to my utter surprise, the Sheriff of Bedford county came and levied upon all of the property of the firm, and the same was sold at Sheriff's sale.

I had given to Mr. Stoner my individual power for my third interest in the Partnership of Homan & Shaffer, of which Mr. Stoner was an equal third partner, and after Mr. Homan had confessed judgments against the firm, as stated, without my knowledge and consent, a bill for debts of which I had no knowledge and which I did not contract, executions were issued in Centre county, my personal property was seized and an attempt made to sell my real estate at Sheriff's sale, when I was compelled to interfere with legal process to prevent the same being done.

After frequent attempts to secure a settlement of the partnership affairs between Stoner, Homan and myself, and complete failure to accomplish the same amicably, I consulted Mr. Clement D. Die and Chas. W. E. Reder, who advised that I had been badly used and taken advantage of, and that I should proceed by "Bill in Equity" to compel a settlement of the co-partnership, and a statement of the accounts between the partners. Accordingly THE SUIT WAS BROUGHT BY ME to No 1 November Term, 1902, in Equity in the Courts of Centre County in which E. S. Shaffer is plaintiff and George E. Homan and John Stoner are defendants.

The Master of Accounts appointed by the Court to take the testimony and state the accounts between the co-partners, was N. B. Spangler; his Report has just been completed and is in the hands of Counsel for examination:

THE FINDINGS OF THE MASTER. The findings of the Master are sufficient to set at rest and completely brand as a falsification the malicious charges and insinuations contained in that article of the Gazette; THE MASTER FINDS: That the entire operation in Bedford county was in the hands of Mr. Homan;

That I was not there and could not be there because of the illness and subsequently the death of my wife;

That no money, either of Mr. Stoner's or of the firm, passed through my hands;

That no checks were drawn by me at any time; and that I have not received from the proceeds of the lumber operations referred to, any money or sums with the exception of \$392.12, of which amount a check of \$20.00 was given to me by the firm for a tax assessed by the firm, and which became a part of the firm property, leaving a balance of \$372.12 which WAS ALL RECEIVED out of the entire transaction of something in the neighborhood of \$7000.

My total investment in the firm was about \$1000. I have received nothing from this partnership business except the \$392.12 and I have, growing out of this transaction, entered against me liens that are sufficient to entirely deprive me of every vestige of real and personal property I ever owned in the world—in short because of this unfortunate business operation, which I was entrusting to Mr. Stoner and Mr. Homan, I have lost every dollar in the world, and being a poor man before I went into the operation, I feel that I have actually lost more comparatively than Mr. Stoner, who was and still is a rich man.

In support of this statement I refer you to the testimony taken before the Master, Mr. N. B. Spangler, and the findings of fact by the Master, of which Mr. Harter had positive knowledge by one of my counsel, who went to Mr. Harter, and advised Mr. Harter not to publish the Stoner letter, for the reason that it was untruthful and was calculated to put me in a false light before the public.

With all the information that has been obtained, since the publication in the Keystone Gazette, as to the manner in which Mr. Stoner was induced to sign that statement for public print and the base ill will resorted to accomplish a statement, intending to rob me of my reputation, and the evident motive involved I am satisfied to allow the public to be the jury in this transaction and to determine whether I am the unprincipled individual Mr. Harter sought to point; or whether I am not the wronged victim of an unfortunate business transaction that perhaps might have turned out very advantageously had I been able to give it my personal attention, as I had hoped to be able to do, when I became interested in the firm of Homan & Shaffer.

GEORGE E. HOMAN'S STATEMENT.

In justice to Mr. Ellis S. Shaffer, whose integrity has been so maliciously assailed in the Keystone Gazette, I desire, as member of the late firm of Homan & Shaffer, consisting of John Stoner, Ellis S. Shaffer and myself, to declare that owing to the illness and subsequent death of Mrs. Shaffer, her husband, Ellis S. Shaffer, was prevented from giving the Bedford county lumber operation any attention. That in consequence of bills being contracted by me, that no funds were collected or paid out by him. That no checks were drawn by him. That no funds or assets of the firm were received by him except \$392 of which \$200 were paid by Mr. Shaffer for a term for the firm. That because of the unfortunate outcome of the enterprise, Mr. Shaffer and I have both lost heavily and can ill afford to bear it. These losses were through no lack of attention on our part, but arose out of conditions that we could not control.
