

FIRE NEAR MADISONBURG.

Destroys the Large Farm Barn on the Harvey H. Miller Farm—Eighteen Head of Cattle Burned.

The barn on the farm of Harvey H. Miller, three-fourths of a mile east of Madisonburg, was totally destroyed by fire Saturday night.

Saturday evening Harry Miller, a son of the owner, and tenant on the Miller farm, together with his wife and small children drove to Madisonburg, and at about nine o'clock returned to their home.

Mr. Miller, the owner of the farm, had an insurance of \$960 on the barn, in the Centre County Mutual Fire Insurance Company, while the son, the tenant, had \$1600 insurance in the Anville Fire Insurance Company.

In 1856, the Miller barn was built by Hon. Samuel Frank, of Rebersburg, who at that time owned the farm.

An Engineer's Find.

Wednesday morning the engineer on the east bound freight train spied two watches, a necklace, photograph of a lady, and several other trinkets, lying at the tool house east of Centre Hall station.

The articles were undoubtedly part of a plunder secured by robbers, who did not want to run the risk of being caught with stolen goods that might be identified.

A further investigation by Assistant Station Agent Ishler, revealed a bunch of twenty or more receipts, which indicate that depredations had been committed by the disgorgers at Renovo.

The State Grange.

Important Matters Being Discussed of Interest to All Farmers.

Fully one thousand delegates were present at the opening session of the Pennsylvania State Grange, Sunbury, Tuesday.

Among the most important matters discussed affecting the farmers and public generally was a resolution passed by the legislative committee of Shilo Grange, asking for the repeal of the vaccination law.

From a number of sources measures were introduced with a view to procure equalization of taxation.

Another subject on which the grange plans to make itself heard is the extension of graded schools to rural districts.

The committee on legislation is believed to have a report ready on the parcels post question, as well as provision to carry freight on rural trolley lines.

Both of these moves, it is virtually assured, will be heartily endorsed, and measures taken to bring about their realization.

In line with these public utilities is the demand of the Centre county Pomona Grange for rural public telephone lines.

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


