

Wood Pavements In Cities.

"The power of the country press in Washington surprises me." said a middlewest congressman last winter. 'During my two terms I have been impressed with it constantly. doubt if there is a single calm utterance in any paper in the United States that does not carry some weight in Washington among the members of Congress. You might think that what some little country editor says does not amount to anything, but it means a great deal more than most peopl realize. When the country editor, who is looking after nothing but the county printing, gives expression to some rational idea about a national question, the man off here in Congress knows that it comes from the grass The lobby, the big railroad lawyers and that class of people realze the power of the press, but they hate it. I have heard them talk about it and shake their heads and say, 'Too much power there!' The press is more powerful than money.'

This is not said in flattery, but because he had seen on congressmen's desks the heaps of country weeklies, and he knew how closely they were read. The smallest editiorial paragraph tells the politician of the condition in that paper's community, for he knows that it is put there because the editor has gathered the idea from someone whom he trusts as a leader—and the politician knows approximately who that leader is.
