# Measuring Moonlight.

A novel means of measuring moonlight is furnished by the selenium cell, through its well-known variations of electric resistance in light of different intensity. By this method the light of the full moon has been lately determined to be a little more than one-fifth (.21) of a standard candlepower and about nine

times the light of the half-moon. The gibbous disc proves to be brighter before than after full moon. The selenium cell is not perfectly reliable as a test for light of varying color, but it has been found sufficiently accurate and sensitive to indicate the central phase of a lunar eclipse with-


