CHURCH DROPS BIBLE.

Owing to the growing lack of interest in the Bible on the part of the young men members of the Sunday School class of the First Congregational Church of Jersey City, the church has decided to abandon the International Sunday School lessons and go in for sociology. Prohibition, protection, free trade, socialism, single tax, municipal government, social betterment, and kindred subjects will be taken up instead. The church is one of the largest in Jersey City, the Rev. John L. Scudder, who has become well known to the Jersey City public because of his war on illegal liquor selling, being the pastor.

The Bible class, as a strictly Bible class, has been abandoned, and Nelson Forman elected president of the sociology class, and Lester Mehrhoff secretary of the new class. C. E. Adams, a New York commission merchant, will be the sociology teacher.

There has been considerable discussion, but no open opposition to the new church plan; most of Dr. Scudder's members having frankly acknowledged that something had to be done to maintain the interest in the church. Dr. Scudder explained yesterday some of the reasons for the change.

"The lessons from the lives of Abraham, Jacob, and the rest of the Old Testament heroes are interesting and beneficial," he said, "but they do not touch modern life intimately enough to interest young men. The young man of today is face to face with economic and social problems which did not exist in Biblical times. These problems are pressing for solution, and the minds of our young men should be guided correctly in their thought upon them."

Weekly Review of Trade and Latest Market Reports.

Bradstreet's says:

"Trade, crop and industrial reports are still very irregular, but the underlying tone of business generally is slightly more optimistic. All present or future favorable occurrences, however, cannot disguise the fact that some lines of industry are still very much depressed; that the first crop report of the year—that made by the Government of winter wheat—is a poor one, indicating a short crop; that buying is still hampered in some sections by unfavorable weather or by the reduced purchasing power of the public, and that caution and conservatism still govern commercial operations to a large degree."

"Business failures in the United States for the week were 227, against 204 last week, 258 in the like week of 1908, 294 in 1907, 161 in 1906 and 136 in 1905."

"Wheat, including flour, exports from the United States and Canada for the week aggregate 1,062,244 bushels, against 1,413,593 bushels last week and 2,451,099 bushels this week last year. Corn exports for the week are 226,898 bushels, against 1,102,244 bushels last week and 545,714 bushels in 1908."

Use Dogs In Sanitation.



KAISER PHONES PECULIARLY.

The German Emperor has his own way of using the telephone. Despite mistakes, caused by the Kaiser's refusal to name himself at the opening of his conversation, he invariably introduces his telephoned orders merely with the words: "I command that," and so forth. The significance of this arrangement is supposed to be that the chief is having something like an audience with His Majesty, and that it would be presumptuous for a person not summoned to hear the Imperial voice to occupy the room into which his tones are conveyed. At the end of the conversation the Emperor walks away without saying "good-by," and the chief with whom he has conversed must listen for five or six minutes afterward to make sure that orders have been completed. Then he calls back his assistants and the usual etiquette resumes.

Two Millions Use Playgrounds.

The records of Chicago's special park commission show how extensively the public playgrounds are used in that city. Five hundred thousand more children took advantage of them in 1908 than in 1907, the attendance being 2,089,366. Ten new small parks were improved last year, making the total 45. It is expected that 16 additional playgrounds will be created this year, ranging in size from one-quarter of an acre to eight acres. All this work was carried on last year with an appropriation of \$180,390 and private gifts of \$3,700, and yet there was an unexpended balance of \$33,311. Chicago is far ahead of New York in providing playgrounds for its children.
