

the collection, remission and refundment of the proposed law rests with the commissioner of internal revenue in the same manner as other internal revenue taxes.

While the corporations are required to supply information of a most intimate character relating to their business, provision is made to safeguard them against wrongful use of data obtained for the purpose of as-sessing the tax. Penalties are provided in case of false or fraudulent
