Undertakers Form Association.

The Central Pennsylvania Undertakers' Association, composed of ninety delegates from twenty counties, was formed here.

Fatally Injured In Explosion.

Wilkes-Barre.—Evan Thomas was fatally and four other men slightly injured by the explosion of a powder magazine in a stone quarry at Buttonwood.

Pittsburg.—The National Executive Committee of the Council of Jewish Women, in convention here, elected Miss Sadie American, of New York, a delegate to the convention of the international White Slave Traffic Suppression Association, to be held at Madrid next May.

Strikes Oil At Coopersburg.

Bethlehem.—While drilling an artesian well at the Gabriel Hosley Dell, at Coopersburg, workmen at a depth of 165 feet struck oil.

Dies As Doctor Treats Him.

Reading.—Attorneys for Miss Helen Jones, a pretty young woman of Lehigh County, instituted a suit for damages against Eugene B. Bauer, a prominent young farmer of Hereford, this county, for breach of promise of marriage.

Governor Grants Charters.

Governor Stuart approved the charter of the Titusville Central Railroad, to build a line from Titusville to Cory. The capital is \$210,000.

Seven Million Feet Of Walnut Burn.

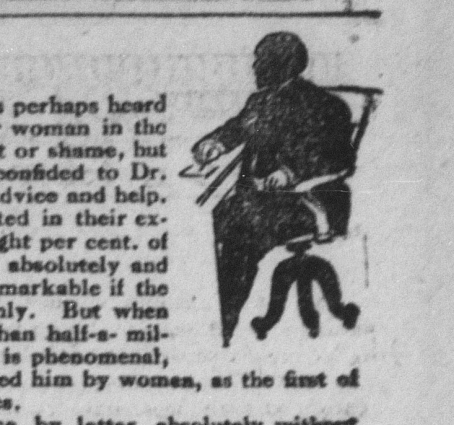

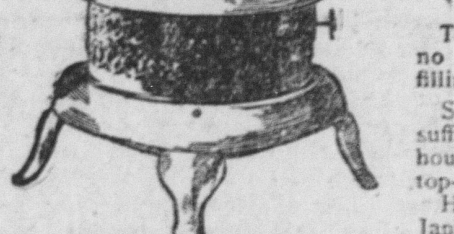
