Bradstreets's says; "Trade undercurrents are running little more freely in consonance with the progress of the season, but the improvement is neither widespread nor marked. While the larger centres report that salesmen are sending in better orders for dry goods and kindred lines, less important cities, with a few exceptions, principally in the South, agree that trade is not better than fair to good. 
