## PROCLAIM GOMEZ THEIR PRESIDENT

Action of Mexican Rebels Under Orozco.

### SETS UP OFFICE AT JUAREZ

The Town Which Madero Made the Provisional Capital After the Fall Of Juarez Last May.

El Paso, Tex.—Gen. Emilio Gomez was proclaimed provisional president of Mexico by the rebels, and he has established himself at Juarez. Gomez arrived here Friday night and crossed to Juarez Saturday. At 1 o'clock he announced he had accepted the provisional presidency of Mexico, tendered him in the name of the revolution by Pascual Orozco.

When he reached Juarez Gomez was escorted to the custom house, which Madero made the provisional capital after the fall of Juarez, May 10, 1911.

Col. Pascual Orozco, father of General Orozco, was announced as minister of war in the new cabinet. Moreno Canton, of Yucatan, was named minister of foreign relations. It was said other cabinet appointments would be made later.

### TITANTIC INQUIRY ENDS.

The Senate Committee's Report Being Prepared.

New York.—When the Senate committee's investigation of the sinking of the Titanic was completed here Saturday night by Senator William Alden Smith it became known that the committee's report, which may be ready for the Senate in a week, will be based on these facts brought out in the testimony:

The Titanic was warned of icebergs by other vessels.

The liner was running 23 knots an hour and did not slacken speed.

Captain Smith was not on the bridge, but at dinner in the "crow's nest" was not provided with binoculars.

There was no evidence that the water-tight compartments were closed at all.

There was no testimony that the life-saving apparatus and safety devices were properly tested before the Titanic left Southampton.

There were lifeboats for not more than one-third of those on board.

It was learned that some of the things that Senator Smith's report to the Senate will recommend are:

More complete American inspection of liners.

Requirement of lifesaving apparatus and lifeboats sufficient for all on board and efficient water-tight compartments.

Standardization of the wireless.

There will be an international wireless convention in Berlin in July, and Senator Smith said that this phase of the lesson taught by the Titanic disaster will be taken up there.

### 17,000 WOMEN MARCH.

Suffragists' Parade in New York a Great Demonstration.

New York.—Seventeen thousand women of all ages marched up Fifth avenue from Washington Arch, passing at first through silent, unmoved, curious, sometimes gibing ranks of a million onlookers. They ended the parade for equal suffrage at Fifty-seventh street, amid a continuous applause throughout the miles of their ranks, won not by their cause, but by themselves by their earnestness, their discipline, their presentation of a splendid womanhood which made all who watched them proud to know them as American mothers, sisters, wives or sweethearts. They have not won the ballot, but they won New York.

There were women, men and children in the ranks. Almost every profession and industry in which women are engaged from educational leadership to laundry work was represented by a delegation under appropriate banners.

### WHOLE FAMILY BURNED.

Miner, Wife and Child Die in Home.

Beckley, W. Va.—Three persons were burned to death when five company houses of the E. E. White Coal Company were destroyed by fire near here. The victims were John Maxon, a miner, his wife and child.

### STILL AFTER STEEL TRUST.

House Will Investigate Relations With Navy Department.

Washington.—An investigation into the contracts of the Navy Department with the United States Steel Corporation was ordered by the House, which adopted a resolution by Representative Stanley, of Kentucky, chairman of the steel trust investigating committee, calling on the Secretary of the Navy to furnish such information.

Weekly Review of Trade and Market Reports.

### NEW YORK.—R. G. Dun & Co.'s Weekly Review of Trade says:

"That the recent improvement in the volume of trade is fully maintained is evidenced by the latest statistics. These proofs of business activity are all the more significant because weather conditions have not been altogether favorable to distribution and retail trade has, in particular, been somewhat checked as a consequence."

Bradstreet's says:

"Trade reports are irregular in tone, with here and there streaks of disappointment, but on the whole the trend is in a satisfactory direction. The dry goods trade in general reports that untoward weather has hurt retail trade.

"Wheat, including flour, exports from the United States and Canada for the week aggregate 3,169,514 bushels, against 2,843,789 last week and 1,685,666 this week last year. Corn exports for the week are 76,472 bushels, against 540,484 last week and 733,567 in 1911."
