PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION NO. I Shall Section One of Article Eight of the Constitution be Amended to read as follows ? Section 1. Every citizen, male or female, of twenty-one years of age, possessing the following qualifications, shall be entitled to return ds follows : the registration of electors as the General Assembly may enact: First. He or she shall have been a citizen of the United States at least one month. Second. He or she shall have resided in the State one year (or, having previously been a qualified elector or native-born citizen of the State, he or she shall have removed therefrom and returned, then six Third. He or she shall have resided in the election district where he or she shall offer to vote at least two months immediately preceding the election. Third. He or she shall have resided in the election district where he or she shall offer to vote at least two months immediately preceding the election. Fifth. Wherever the words "he" or "his", "him" and "himself" occur in any section of Article VIII of this Constitution the same shall be construed as if written respectively, "he or she," "his or her," "him or her," and "himself or herself."

PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION NO. 2 Shall Section Eight of Article Nine of the Constitution be Amended to read as follows ?

Section 8. PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION NO. 3 Shall Section Twenty-one of Article Three of the Constitution be Amended to read as follows ?

The General Assembly may enact laws requiring the payment by employers, or employers and employes jointly, or reasonable compensation for injuries to employes arising in the course of their employment and for occupational diseases of employes, whether or not such injuries or diseases result in death, and regardless of fault of employer, and fixing the basis of ascertainment of such compensation and the maximum and minimum limits thereof, and providing special or general remedies for the collection thereof ; but in no other cases shall the General Assembly limit the amount to be recovered for injuries, the right of action shall survive, and the General Assembly shall prescribe for whose benefit such actions shall be prose cuted. No act shall prescribe any limitations of time within which suits may be brought against corporations for injuries to persons or property, or for other causes, different from those fixed by general laws requiring actions against natural persons, and such acts now existing are avoided.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION NO. 4 Shall the Constitution be Amended to read as follows ?

Laws may be passed providing for a system of registering, transferring, insuring of and guaranteeing land titles by the State, or by the counties thereof, and for settling and determining adverse or other claims to and interest in lands the titles to which are so registered, transferred, insured and guaranteeing land titles by the State, or by the counties thereof, and for settling and determining adverse or other provided for into effect by such existing courts as may be designated by the Legislature, and by the establishment or such new courts as may be deemed necessary. In matters arising in and under the operation of such system, judicial powers, with right of appeal, may be conferred by the Legislature upon county recorders and upon other officers by it designated. Such laws may provide for continuing the registering, transferring, insuring and containing such titles after the first or original registration has been perfected by the court, and provision may be made for raising , the necessary funds for expenses and salaries of officers, which shall be paid out of the treasury of the several counties.
