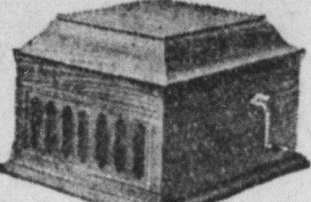


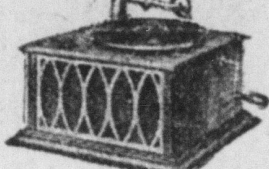

OUR MERCHANT MARINE

From Republican platform of 1872: "It is the duty of the General Government to adopt such measures as may tend to encourage and restore American commerce and shipbuilding." That duty was unfulfilled.

From Republican platform of 1884 (twelve years later): "We call upon Congress to remove the burdens under which American shipping has been depressed, so that it may again be true that we have a commerce that leaves no sea unexplored."

From Republican platform of 1888: "We earnestly recommend that prompt action be taken by Congress in the enactment of such legislation as will best secure the rehabilitation of our American merchant marine, and we protest against the passage by Congress of a free-ship bill."

From Republican platform of 1892: "We favor the restoration of our merchant marine by home-built ships."

From Republican platform of 1896: "We favor restoring the American policy of discriminating duties for the rebuilding of our merchant marine and the protection of our shipping in the foreign carrying-trade."

From Republican platform of 1900: "Our present dependence upon foreign shipping for nine-tenths of our foreign carrying trade is a great loss to the industry of this country."

From Republican platform of 1904: "While every other industry has prospered under the fostering aid of Republican legislation, American shipping engaged in foreign commerce in competition with the low cost of construction, low wages, and heavy subsidies of foreign governments has not for many years received from the government of the United States adequate encouragement of any kind."

From Republican platform of 1908: "We adhere to the Republican doctrine of encouragement to American shipping and urge such legislation as will advance the merchant marine prestige of the country, so essential to the national defense..."
