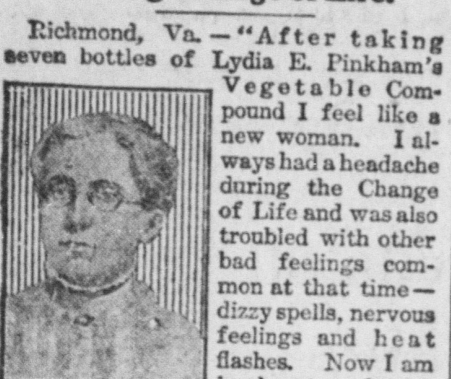

## CARDS NOT NEEDED IN WORK AT HOME

Boys Under 16 Years May Make Cigars, Attorney General Brown's Ruling.

Harrisburg.—An employment certificate is not required for a minor between the ages of fourteen and sixteen years if employed on the farm or in private homes, but would be necessary under the Act of 1915 in case of domestic service rendered in other than private homes, according to an opinion given to M. B. King, director of the Bureau of Vocational Education, by Attorney General Brown. The attorney general suggests that the requirement that minors be able to read and write should be "vigorously enforced."

In an opinion given to Commissioner Jackson, of the Department of Labor and Industry, the attorney general holds that the State Industrial Board has authority to forbid employment of minors between fourteen and sixteen in the making of cigars. The question arose over the construction of the term "manufacturing tobacco," which is prohibited to minors.

Mr. Brown says that he is of the opinion that it would not be unlawful for a minor to make cigars, which is the mere assembling of the manufactured tobacco into the form of a "cigar," but that care must be taken to see that the minor does not engage in manufacturing tobacco and that the hours of labor must be adhered to. The Industrial Board, however, has authority to designate what employment should be forbidden to minors.

Daily Wage Argued.  
The question of what shall be defined as a daily wage in calculating payments under the workmen's compensation system was discussed by representatives of capital and labor before the State Compensation Board.

Representatives of mine operators and workers, railroads and railroad brotherhoods and of numerous other occupations were present. The principal argument was made by Roger J. Dever, of Wilkes-Barre, counsel for the United Mine Workers in three anthracite districts, who objected to some of the suggestions for the daily wage as not being equitable.

James H. Maurer, of Reading, president of the State Federation of Labor, took the same view as Mr. Dever. Harry S. Lydick, of Pittsburgh, and E. B. Crighton, Philadelphia, spoke for coal operators, and after a general discussion Chairman Mackey announced that requests had been made for further hearings from persons interested.

Sheep Raising in Pennsylvania.  
The State Department of Agriculture in a bulletin states that Pennsylvania live stock ranks high, but that sheep raising is on a decline. The Keystone State live stock is rated at 2.6 of all the live stock of the country, the percentage of milk cows in the State being 4.3 of those in the country. The sheep industry is falling off, the total number of 806,000 being a drop from 1,020,000 ten years ago.

The bulletin notes an improvement of lumberland county live stock by introducing pure-blooded stock, while in fifty-five counties of the State, the condition of dairy cows either is normal or above the average.

Justices of Peace Named.  
The following were appointed justices of the peace: D. H. Colgan Wiley, East Nottingham Township, Chester county; Ray E. Bohner, Washington Township, Dauphin county; Ivan G. Sherbondy, Springfield Township, Fayette county; Harry W. Seaman, Benton Township, Lackawanna county; John P. Moore, Jefferson Township, Lackawanna county, and L. C. Lose, Limestone Township, Lycoming county.

Oleo Licenses Good Only in One Town.  
An opinion was given by Deputy Attorney General Hargest to the State Dairy and Food Commissioner that merchants holding licenses to sell oleomargarine at retail cannot take orders for that product in any city or town except that designated in the license.

Deputy Attorney General Collins holds in an opinion to the Department of Labor and Industry that if the Seamen's Boarding Housekeepers' Association, Inc., Philadelphia, conducts the business of an employment agency it must take out a State license.

Boston's Nocturnal Habits.  
A wild pigeon that has a haunt somewhere near the old Boston City club has formed a habit of coming down into the street late at night for his supper.
