Ancient Election Customs. No complaint with regard to undue limitation of polling time was possible in the old British parliamentary days. The danger was that polling might be prolonged for a fortnight or a month. Drastic action to bring the poll to a close once provoked a riot in the Westminster division of London. At the general election that began on April 25, 1741, the two Westminster candidates were on the fifth day of polling well ahead; but an opposition party of electors approaching the hustings in great force, the high balliff (who favored the ministerialists) declared that he feared a riot, and closed the poll. The baffled voters rioted and the military were called out. The high balliff had afterwards to apologize on his knees to the speaker and pay a heavy fine.
