Answer to American Note as to Armed Trade Ships.

BREAK MAY BE DELAYED

According To Her Declaration "Freedom Of the Seas" In War Time "Applies Only To Neutral Vessels, Not To Neutral Persons.

Washington .-- Austria's reply to the Germany.

Although in substance the long communication holds and defends the unrestricted warfare waged by Germany, it is couched in most friendly terms and points out that "Austrian submarines solely are operating in the Adriatic and the Mediterranean, and therefore an encroachment on American interests hardly is to be feared." There will be a reply to this note, and unless an overt act precipitates the rupture both sides apparently earnestly desire to avoid, the United States probably will not be inclined to force the issue for the present.

Germany Forcing Austria.

The truth is that Germany is credited with trying to force Austria to a step which that country does not wish to take. Germany naturally wishes, it is pointed out, to have the complete moral support of her allies to the submarine campaign and is using her great influence with Austria to that end.

This opinion is based not only on dispatches from Ambassador Penfield, at Vienna, but on the whole length and spirit of the Austrian note. Not Quite Clear.

Manufacturers of America, If They Are Wise, Will Seek to Lower Protection Cost.

A Missouri manufacturer tells a New York Herald reporter that heavy protection will be needed, and there are some articles of necessity that Japan could sell here, even if the tariff

protection were 100 per cent. No doubt. Japan has a wonderfully efficient manufacturing population, and the people are all industrious and thrifty. While it is true that wages in Japan have been steadily increasing for many years, and have gone upward considerably since the beginning of the

war, they are yet far under American wage levels and always will be. But how are we going to compete with Japan in the markets of the world if it requires 100 per cent protection to enable American manufacturers to overcome the advantages Japan enjoys in the lower cost of production?

Japan is at the highest tide of prosperity in the entire history of the emplre. High prices here have driven Russia to buy much in Japan that she used to buy in the United States, and at the close of the war Japanese skill, efficiency and lower cost of production will probably enable Japan to continue to hold much of the new business which has come from Russia since the present war brought complete reconciliation to the two countries.


Not only that, Japan is clearly headed for a greater commerce with China, and no doubt she will get much of the

Those who are demanding prohibitive tariffs to protect manufacturers after the war are doomed to encounter some sad experience if, through the folly of the people, the protectionists are permitted to dictate another tariff bill. We are sure to find the rising cost of production fatal to the development of the world trade which many think within our reach.

Effect Of a Break.

Officials here have felt throughout that a break with Austria would serve little purpose and do much harm America's protest against Germany's illegal submarine warfare is thought to have been fully enforced by a severence of relations with that govern ment

A break with Austria probably would be followed by one with Bulgaria and Turkey, jeopardizing American interests in those countries; would lead to many diplomatic re-adjust ments because of the belligerents this country represents in Austria and the Austrian interests represented else where, and would endanger the million or more prisoners for whom this coun try has been caring, as well as cut off a line of communication from Berlin.

U. S. ARMY GROWS RAPDILY.

About 5,000 Men Have Enlisted Since German Break.

Washington .-- With the shadow ef war hanging over the nation all army enlistment records for peace times were broken during February. Ap proximately 5,000 men signed up for service. The actual figures to date show 5,852, but figures are still com ing in from field camps and the re-en listments. The figures are especially gratifying to the department. Prac tically all of the enlistments came after the diplomatic break with Ger many, on February 3.


