No More Seedlings Available.

Commissioner of Forestry Robert S. Conklin issued orders Monday to the effect that no more applications for free seedlings be filled this year. Practically all of the stock left the State Forest nurseries has started growth, and it is therefore unsafe to nove it. What remains must be held

over for next year's planting. Applications for free seedling this spring will total about 1,500,000 trees. Water companies alone have planted almost 500,000. Many applications have been received during the past week which could not be granted because the supply of the species requested was exhausted.
