

NUMBERS DRAWN IN DRAFT LOTTERY

One Million, Three Hundred and Seventy-four Thousand Men Called, Subject to Exemptions, to Make up the Necessary 687,000 National Army.

EACH EXEMPTION DISTRICT GETS TWICE ITS QUOTA

Drawing Determines Order in Which Registered Citizens Between 21 and 31 are to Be Called for Examination as to Fitness for Army.

[Explanation:—In the draft every number from 1 to 10,500 was drawn and each number called for service the man bearing that red ink number in every one of the 4,557 districts in the United States. Although the high number recorded is 10,391, the full 10,500 were drawn. When a number was drawn higher than the high serial number in any district it operated as a blank. For instance, all numbers above 4,696 in New York City were blanks, and the same applied above 6,711 in Arizona, 6,811 in Connecticut, 5,765 in New Jersey, 4,177 in New Mexico, 7,882 in Pennsylvania, 4,068 in Rhode Island, and so on. The highest serial number in New York State is 7,543 in Niagara Falls.]
