

in wheat were 1,105,000,000 bushels. The production of Europe was 645,000, 000 bushels, leaving 460,000,000 bushels to be exported from North America. It was estimated that the United States and Canada would have for export 300,000,000 bushels so that 160, 000,000 would have to be made up.

Mr. Hanna said the figures for beef are equally disturbing and if the shortage is not made up the allied cause will fail. The problem would be met, he said, if each consumer would reduce by one-third his consumption of beef, bacon and wheat. He suggested the free use of fish and vegetables with smaller portions and corn and oat meal instead of wheat. Elimination of waste in hotels, restaurants and home in Canada, Mr. Hanna said, would work an enormous saving.

There was a strong case for compulsion, he declared, if the letters he was receiving were any indication. Distribution was an important factor and here waste was rampant.



While it has been asserted that this sum probably is the largest amount of gold coin and bullion ever accumulated in one place, it is well to remember that only so recently as a year ago there was said to be \$800,000,000 in gold and bullion in the Russian

State bank. The sum in New York figures out something like this: There are approximately 39,000,000 ounces or 3,000,-000 pounds or 1,646 tons. The figures are not exact.


