 1/2 cup boiling water  
 1/2 cup milk

 1/2 cup flour  
 1/2 cup salt  
 5 teaspoons Royal Baking Powder  
 NO EGGS

Soak corn meal in bowl with boiling water; add milk, melted shortening and molasses; add flour, salt and baking powder which have been sifted together; mix well. Bake on hot greased griddle until brown.  
 (The Old Method called for 2 eggs)

### Eggless, Milkless, Butterless Cake

1 cup brown sugar  
 1/2 cup water  
 1 cup seeded raisins  
 3 ounces citron, cut fine  
 1/2 cup shortening  
 5 teaspoons Royal Baking Powder

Soil sugar, water, fruit, shortening, salt and spices together in saucepan 5 minutes. When cool, add flour and baking powder which have been sifted together. Mix well; bake in hot pan in moderate oven about 45 minutes.  
 (The Old Method [Fruit Cake] called for 2 eggs)
