




We feel safe then to leave our money in charge of that bank and its officers. They will use it in various ways which seem good to them, but we will get it all back, if the bank is sound. Therefore, when the United States government turns banker, the safest place for our money to be put is in the hands of this government. Anybody can see that, without bothering to look twice. Uncle Sam himself will take care of our money, and we'll get it back. We' know that. His word is so good that we can get the money back whenever we need it, because his bonds will sell, any time, for just about what we pay for them. A few years hence, of course, they will sell for more than we

pay for them. During the time that we leave our money with Uncle Sam-what we call the Liberty Loan-he pays us interest. Well, I've had a higher per cent than he pays-not for a loan, because 1 had to pay taxes that reduced the per cent to 31/4-but on investments. Once I made an investment that paid 19 per cent, but it only paid it once, and then the fellow who talked me into it left town without telling anybody good-by. I've found, since then, that I can't get much better than Uncle Sam's rate in the long run. When I think I can, usually the factory has to have new bollers, after my first dividend comes in, or the ore "isn't quite the quality we had reason to expect," and I begin the long squirm to get out with something reasonably near what I put in. No; noyadays I think the government rate is about all I'm going to get from any investment which I place with regard to the investment's margin of safety. Therefore I get all I can of Uncle Sam's





ESCAPED ACTIVE SERVICE.

1,772 Men Within Draft Age Got Swivel Chair Commissions.

Washington .- In response to a resoution of inquiry by Senator Thomas, of Colorado, which followed much adverse criticism of the number of officers of draft age kept in Washington on noncombatant duty, Acting Secretary of War Crowell advised the Senate that 1,772 army officers within traft age, who have received commissions since the outbreak of the war, are in Washington holding staff assignments. Of these 778 are with the Ordnance Bureau, 336 with the Signal Corps. 296 in the Medical Corps and 181 in the quartermaster service.

## CONGRESSMAN JONES DEAD.

Served Many Years From First Virginia District.

Washington .-- Representative William A. Jones, of Warsaw, Va., died here from the effects of a stroke of paralysis suffered more than a week ago. He was 69 years eld, and his death is the seventh among members of the House of Representatives during the Sixty-fifth Congress.

NEW DRAFT BILL IN WAY.

Regitsration Measure Ordered Favorably Reported.

Washington .- The Senate resolution for registration of men who have, reached 21 years of age since June 5, 1917, was ordered favorably reported to the House. The registration date would be fixed by presidential proclamation.


