

THIRTY-EIGHT TO ENTRAIN FRIDAY

Will Go To Camp Wadsworth, S. C. Other Schedules For August.

LIST OF THOSE WHO REGISTERED JUNE 5

Designates Order in Which New Registrants Will Be Called—Men Re-classified to Class 1 Are Returned to Class 4.

This Thursday the thirty-eight men to leave for Camp Wadsworth, South Carolina, on Friday, are gathering in Bellefonte and tonight will be given a fitting reception at the Brockert-Hoff House. A list of the men called to report was published in last week's issue of the Centre Democrat.

The married men of Class 4, 1917 registration who have been reclassified to Class 1, have again returned to their original classification in Class 4.

A fitting reception at the A. M. E. church, on Friday evening was tendered to the colored draftees who left Bellefonte for Camp Custer, Battiereck, Mich. on Saturday. The arrangements were in charge of chairman James Summers and his three assistants, Misses Louisa Pendleton, Margaret Pendleton and Jesse Carter but all the members of the A. M. E. church gave a willing hand and did what they could to make everything go along well. The banquet was furnished from materials donated and after the whole affair was over a balance of \$4.20 was left. This balance will be put in the treasury of the colored folks auxiliary of the Bellefonte Chapter of the Red Cross. The new auxiliary has just been started but bids fair to be a good move. At the reception tendered the boys Col. J. L. Spangler was in charge. Addresses were made by Sheriff Geo. H. Yarnell, Will Conley, William Burnside, Rev. Jones, Col. Spangler and William Mills. The evening was pleasantly passed and will be an occasion that the boys will remember in time to come.

At the train on Saturday morning a number of their friends gathered. The boys marched down High street to the music of the drum as rendered by George Glenn. At the head of the line were a number of our leading citizens and at the rear was a detachment of young men. Just before the train was due the draftees sang "My Country 'Tis of Thee" in their own enchanting way. The drum then sounded and the group marched up the platform and got on the train, bidding farewell to their friends as the engine started them on their journey.

The boys who left were the same as published in our last issue of the Centre Democrat except that Charles Baker, Bellefonte did not go.

A call has been issued from the National draft headquarters for 10,000 white men and 500 colored men to leave from Pennsylvania for Camp Lee, Petersburg, Va., the former during the five day period beginning August 25, and the colored men during the three day period beginning August 22.

Centre county's quota has not been determined at draft headquarters, but will likely be about one hundred.
