December 3, 1884. The station building is up. Grenoble's grain house is completed. Yony Deining is getting material on the ground for a planing mill.—Things generally are booming out by the railroad. The Lutheran congregation of Centre Hall has purchased the property on the corner opposite the bank from Mr. Wolf, for their new church. It is the corner formerly known as the Felmeel stand. One of Daniel Wian's most valuable horses died about a week ago.

J. B. Solt is running Grenoble's coal business at the railroad station.

William Pealer intends opening a new store at Spring Mills soon.

W. H. Strohm, a native of Centre Hill, where he was born Jan. 20, 1847, was accidentally killed by the discharge of a gun in the hands of a fellow companion while out on a hunting trip near Red Cloud, Nebraska, to which place he removed about 1877 and took up the practice of law.

**Auto Garage Owners Must Keep Record of Cars Stored.**

An Act, approved by Governor Sprull recently, requires that records must be kept of all cars stored or left for repairs in every garage in the state. The provisions of this act are now in force. A special form has been prepared by the State Highway Department and this must be used by the garage men.

Highway Commissioner Sadler in letter to garage owners and operators sets forth the entire section covering record keeping. It is section 8 of House Bill 295 (Act 284), as follows:

"That the proprietor of every public garage and motor vehicle repair shop shall cause a record to be kept after the manner to be prescribed by the State Highway Commissioner of the names of any and all persons owning or having charge of any motor vehicle stored, left for repair, or any other purpose at any such public garage or motor vehicle repair shop, together with the make, manufacturer's number, name of State of registration and the registration number of such motor vehicles. Such record shall be kept in ink or indelible pencil and shall be open to the inspection of police officers or other proper authorities. Such records shall be retained and be available for a period of one year after entry but not thereafter. He shall also immediately notify the local police authorities and State Highway Commissioner of any such motor vehicle whereon the manufacturer's number or mark has apparently been altered, obliterated or removed."

With the Highway Department receiving complete information concerning stolen cars, and garages keeping records of cars received or stored, it will be possible quickly to locate stolen automobiles if they remain in Pennsylvania.

**An Abundance of Sugar.**

The war department has sold to the United States sugar equalization board 37,000,000 pounds of refined sugar, it was announced by George Zerbriskie, president of the board.

Zerbriskie declared here is abundance of raw sugar in the country, that retail prices should not exceed 11 cents a pound, and that there is no need of hoarding.

He added that profiteering dealers, if reported, may suffer revocation of their licenses, for they are still under the control of the federal food administration, which will not cease to function until the senate signs the peace treaty.

He charged the apparent shortage to speculative exporters, and belated orders from canners and candy makers. Housewives are hoarding sugar unnecessarily, he said, New England having refined sugar stocks sufficient for six months.

To-day (Thursday) Centre county Pomona Grange meets in the Grange hall in this place.

**Paul Musser Now With Boston.**

The sporting pages of the daily newspapers last Friday published the following item concerning a Millheim boy who has been successful as a ball player in the big leagues:

"The Boston Red Sox have bought Pitcher Paul Musser, of the Des Moines Western League club. Musser, who hails from Centre county, this state, has hung up a great record so far this season in the Class A minors."

Musser is a Millheim boy and his friends in Penns. Valley are hopeful that he will "make good" with the Boston Americans. This is the third time he has been in major leagues, he having been with the Washington club some years ago for a brief time and later with the Chicago White Sox, but in each case he was transferred to a minor league without being given a thorough tryout.

**Strawberries Reach High Mark.**

Figures collected by the Bureau of Statistics, State Department of Agriculture, on July 1, show the average price of strawberries in Pennsylvania this season was 21 cents per quart. The price one year ago was 16 1/2 cents and two years ago 12 cents. Consequently, the price this year was 27 per cent. in advance of last year and 75 per cent. over two years ago. The crop this year was not large, which no doubt largely accounts for the high price.

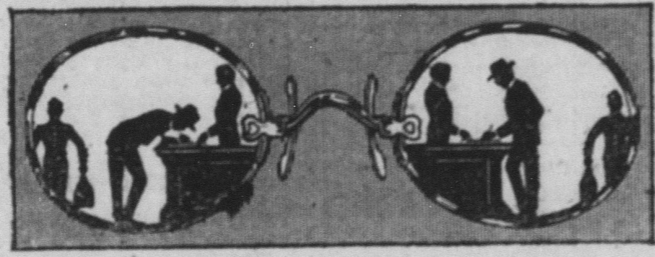
