Paragraphs of News Taken from the Files of the Reporter of 1884.

February 18, 1885.

Robert Ross is here on a visit from Missouri.

Millheim has a musical festival, this week, under Prof. P. H. Meyer.

Our town may have the electric light by next fall. The project is in serious contemplation.

Machinery for the new roller mill has already arrived. The building will go up in a few weeks.

The pipe for the enlarged main and extension of the Centre Hall water works have arrived. Work will begin as soon as the ground is in order for digging.

Methodist Home to be Located at Tyrone.

Tyrone will obtain the home for aged members of the Methodist Episcopal denomination in the Central Pennsylvania conference, which at one time was claimed by Buffalo Valley, near Sunbury.

The board in charge of the work, of which Hon. M. B. Rich, of Woolrich, is president, has purchased the Blair estate at Tyrone, and the property is now being prepared for the use for which it is intended. It is a very desirable property, the present buildings being handsome and commodious, and is well adapted to being converted into a conference home. Rev. W. J. Schaffer, of Jersey Shore, is secretary of the board, and persons desiring information about the conditions of entering can communicate with him.

80,000 Enumerators Needed.

The directors of the Census, Hon. Sam. L. Rogers, announces that 80,000 enumerators will be needed to take the next census. The work begins on January 2 and will last about two weeks in cities, and a month or more in rural districts. Rates of pay will vary, depending upon the locality and character of the district to be canvassed. The average pay per enumerator at the census of 1910 was about \$70. At this coming census it will probably be not less than \$100.

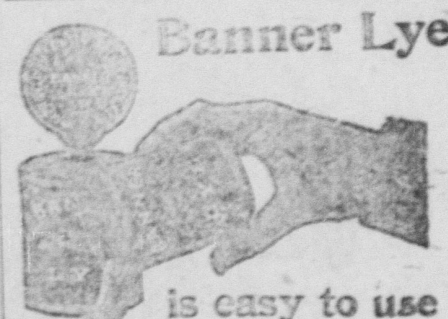

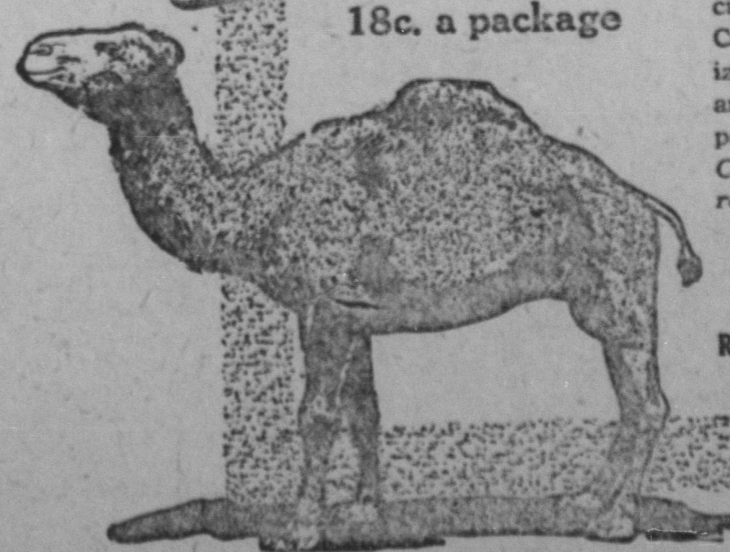
