March 25, 1885.

Our Evangelical friends contemplate erecting a parsonage in this place, on the lot on which their church stands.

Robert P. Barnes, of Pleasant Gap, has the mail contract from Coburn, Centre county, to Lock Haven, Clinton county.

We hear many farmers say their potaoes were frozen in cellar. James Durst had 100 bushels in his cellar, and every one frozen.

Rev. Sarvis preached an excellent farewell sermon in the M. E. church, on Sabbath evening. Mr. Sarvis leaves here with the respect of all our people.

The new Lutheran church at Madisonburg will be dedicated on Sunday. April 19, 1885. Rev. Dr. Conrad, of Philadelphia, will perform the dedicatory services.

One of the oldest buildings in this place, which used to be Felmlee hotel stand, is now on its move eastward, and will be landed on a new foundation two squares from its present site. This building is being removed to olear the lot for the new Lutheran church. Ex-Sheriff Spangler has purchased the old house which is one of the largest in town, and is having it put on his lot nearly opposite Jacob Arney's, and will fit it up for a double dwelling,




