### CHECKER CLUBS IN TOURNEY

Efforts Being Made to Hold Championship Meet at Boston—International Match Impractical.

A committee of the Boston and Wells Memorial Checker clubs has announced that the proposal for an international match in 1920 has been found impractical. Instead, an effort will be made to bring to Boston next August the fifth national checker tournament in connection with the Pilgrim Tercentenary celebration. The national tourneys were suspended in 1915 because of the war.

Harvey Bright, former amateur featherweight champion of New York, has joined the professional ranks.

That noted battery, Pitcher Alexander and Catcher Killefer, will be with the Chicago Nationals next season.

Colville "Red" Jackson, tackle, has been elected captain of the University of Chicago football team for 1920.

W. N. Thompson, fullback on the Wabash college football team, has been elected captain of the 1920 squad.

Glen C. Wilhite, quarterback of the Army football eleven, has been elected captain of the team for next season.

John Kieninger, a junior in the college, has been elected captain of the Columbia varsity football eleven for the season of 1920.

Bike racing was the only sport allowed in France during the war. The races were confined to Paris, where the men met on Sundays.

The Sacramento baseball team of the Pacific coast league has been sold to Louis Moering. William K. Rodgers will be retained as manager.

Allegheny college, Meadville, Pa., will have a new gymnasium ready for use by April next. International and interclass sports are to be boomed.

By defeating the University of California, 7 to 0, the University of Washington won the Pacific coast football championship for the season of 1919.

Ray Bates, third baseman, has been turned back to the Athletics by Los Angeles. He has a sore arm since returning from service in France.

One idea of a thankless task is settling the precedence of teams and players. This indoor diversion should be placed under Marquis of Queensbury rules.

A resolution suggesting organization of a national committee to formulate rules governing boxing exhibitions has been adopted by the New Jersey boxing commission.

George Gibson, veteran catcher, who has been named to succeed Hugo Bezdek as leader of the Pirates, has had enough experience to make good. He is popular in Smoketown.

According to information from Boston, Jim Thorpe, the Indian athlete, is to be sold. He batted over 300 last season, but was used almost exclusively against left-handed pitchers.

### FIRST BASEBALL PAY

Lawrence Perry says: "This is the fifty-third anniversary of the year when it began not to be considered a disgrace to accept money for playing baseball. It was in 1867 that three members of the Athletics of Brooklyn received \$10 a week for playing the game. Every game movement has had its early martyrs; the irony of it is that the three devoted heroes who braved calumny and contempt to accept \$10 for playing baseball are unknown and unsung."

### JIM THORPE MAY BE COACH AT COLUMBIA

Great American Athlete May Succeed Fred Dawson.

Indian Would Surely Fill Bill as General Athletic Director at Any College—Nothing of Theorist About Him.

Jim Thorpe, greatest of American all-around athletes, may be named as athletic director at Columbia university to succeed Fred Dawson, who recently resigned. The position calls for a coach for football, baseball and basketball. Thorpe was great at all three sports, and still is. He plays professional baseball in the summer and professional football in the fall. We have never had his equal as a football player, and he just falls short of being a baseball star. Moreover, he is a great track athlete. Thorpe would fill the bill as a general athletic director at Columbia or any other college. Few men have

ever been in his class so far as knowledge of the various major college sports is concerned. There is nothing of the theorist about the great Indian athlete. His knowledge of games has been acquired through actual participation in them. His broad and varied experience should make him an invaluable coach. If he has the ability to instruct others he can't fail.

Columbia no doubt would have to pay Thorpe a big sum to obtain him as Dawson's successor. He would be worth a fancy figure. The big New York institution has had faculty restrictions on football lifted, and is making plans to take its place among the mighty of the gridiron. There will be need of a man of Thorpe's type if Columbia is to have a high ranking eleven.

### TENNIS LEAGUE IS PROPOSED

Plans Promulgated for Formation of Clubs Representing Various Eastern Colleges.

Plans for the formation of an association of lawn tennis clubs representing Yale, Harvard, Princeton and Cornell universities and the University of Pennsylvania, and to be known as the Intercollegiate Tennis league, have been promulgated by C. S. Garland '20, captain of the Blue tennis team, and F. N. Hawks '21, also of Yale university.

### SWIMMING BOOMING AT PENN

Prospects for Championship Team Have Not Been Brighter Since 1915—Diver Is Needed.

George Kistler of the Red and Blue swimming team anticipates a successful season. Prospects for a championship swimming team have not been brighter since 1915, but the Quakers will need a first-class fancy diver.
