### **THIRTY-FIVE YEARS AGO**

#### Paragraphs of News Taken from the Files of the Reporter of 1885.

July 22, 1885.

The Lemont station building is nearly ready for business.

The Centre Hall depot is found entirely too small for the amount of business done here.

Mr. Deininger has put a large force of men at work on his building at the station.

Long's new hotel at the cave is in the hands of the plasterers. It will hardly be opened to the public this season.

Messrs. Isaac Harpster and James Gregg, two young men of this place, have joined Company B, Fifth regiment, National Guard of Pennsylvania, at Bellefonte.

Rev. Jamas Arney, of the Presbyterian church, filled the pulpit of the local Reformed church, on Sunday, instead of Rev. Land, He is here on a visit to his father, Jacob Arney, who has been in failing health for some time.

Another dwelling house was raised at the station last week. It is to be occupied, when finished, by Mr. Wagner, the miller. Before long a number of dwellings will be erected nearby.

Many of our farmers are using selfbinders to harvest their grain.

The corner stone of the new Lutheran church at Centre Hall will be laid next Sunday, the 26th.

#### Pennsylvania Crop Report.

Damage to wheat and rye by severe weather during the past winter, reduction in the production of pork, and the supply of farm labor, the shortest ever known in the State, are the outstanding features of the report issued recently by G. L. Morgan, Pennsylvania Field Agent, U. S. Bureau of Crop Estimates. Winter wheat : Late seeding, severe weather during the past winter, and ice coating forming on the fields has caused considerable damage in all sections of the State and is particularly heavy in the southeastern wheat belt. The condition on April 1 was 88 per cent of a normal which is a decline from December 1. 1919, of eleven points as compared with the average decline of four points, and is one per cent under the average condition of the past ten years on April 1.

Rye : The same damaging influences have prevailed as in the case of wheat. The condition on April I was go per cent of a normal which is a decline of seven points since December 1 1919, and as compared with 98 per cent, April 1. 1919, and 89 per cent, the average condi-


