**THIRTY-FIVE YEARS AGO**

Paragraphs of News Taken from the Files of the Reporter of 1885.

July 20, 1885.  
Teams are busy hauling brick for the new Lutheran church in this place.  
A severe hail storm damaged the corn in sections of eastern Georges Valley, a few days ago.  
The summer school at this place, under the control of Prof. M. Shires, opened with quite a number of students.  
Travel on the turnpike between Centre Hall and Bellefonte has grown less since the opening of the railroad between these points.  
A carload of coal from Phillipsburg, for the Centre Hall roller mill, was the first car load of freight that passed over the Bellefonte and Lemont railroad, on Thursday of last week.  
The other day a young man accompanied by two ladies, got the "Halls" confused, and stepped off the train at Linden Hall instead of Centre Hall, and were compelled to walk five miles through the hot sun.  
The intense heat of the last eight days still continues. On Sunday afternoon there was a light rain.  
Many persons owning land along the railroad have been anxiously awaiting its completion in order to mine and ship ore to market. We have plenty of rich ore beds in this valley, but no one thus far has made any effort to work them.

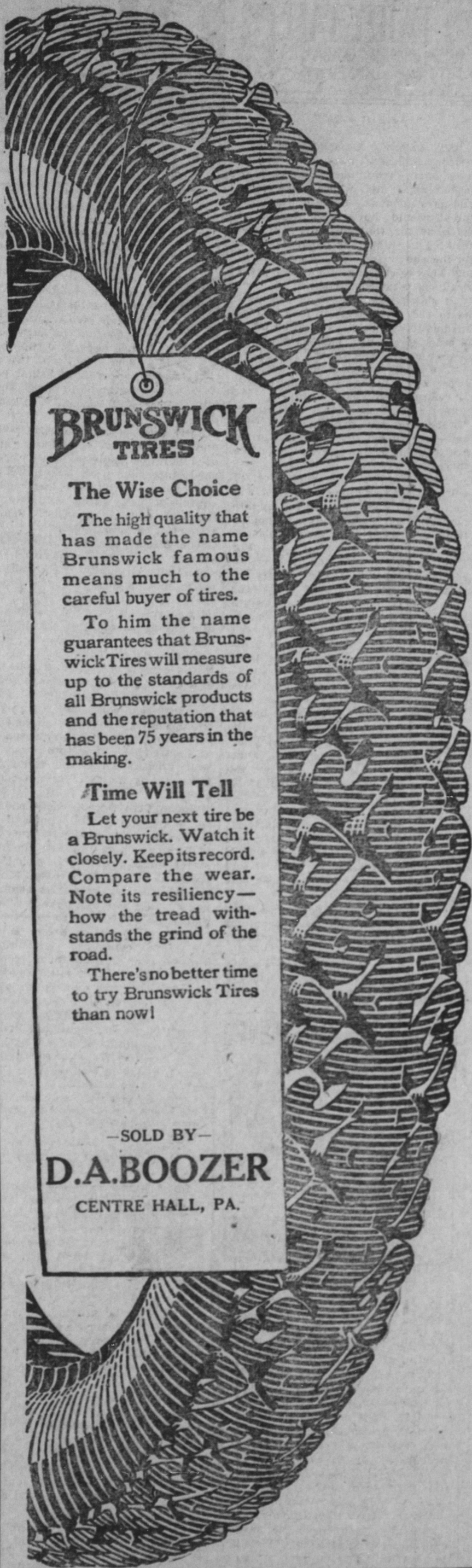

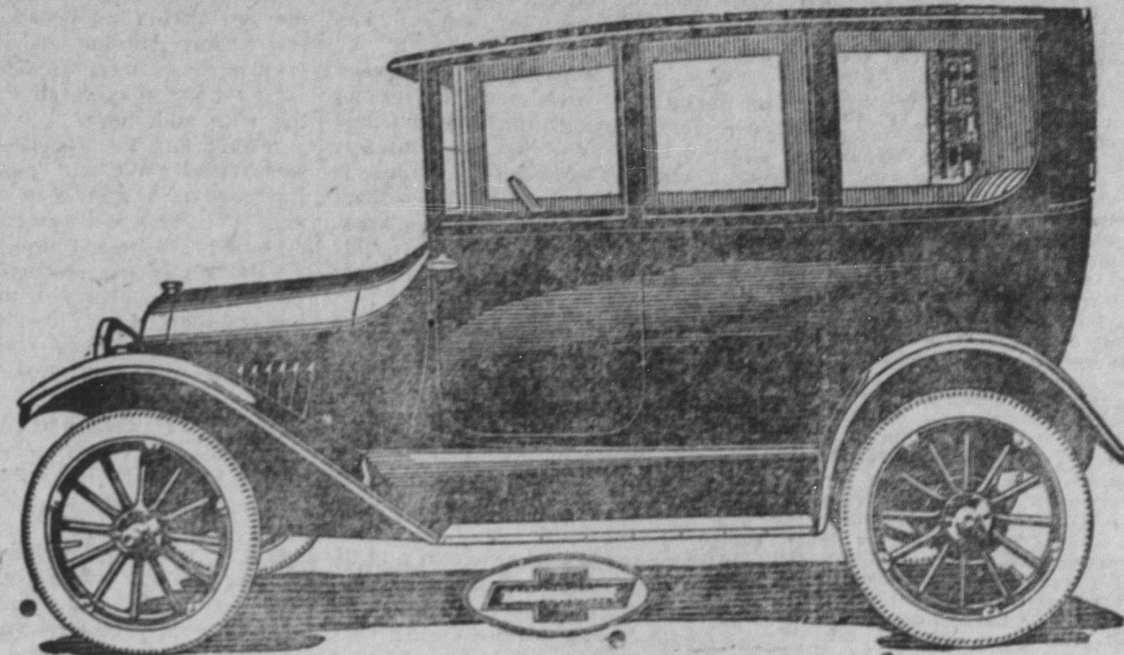
