### State Apple Industry to Be Surveyed

A survey of the apple industry in Pennsylvania upon more comprehensive lines than has ever before been attempted in the state, is being planned by the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture and the Pennsylvania State College. At a conference between Secretary Fred Rasmussen of the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture and R. D. Anthony, of the horticultural department of Penn State, the preliminary

plans for the survey were gone over. Every phase of the apple industry throughout the state will be carefully gone over and a wealth of data, compiled. This will be published in book form and this publication will serve as a complete handbook on the industry in the Keystone state. The soil conditions of various sections of the state and their relation to apple growing will be thoroughly covered, while the apple will be traced from the time the tree leaves the nursery until the ripened fruit is placed in storage for the winter.

The survey of the apple industry is the second work of this kind that has been undertaken under the direction of no journalist, now in America.
