

Fifty million horsepower comprises the total, both steam and water power generated, now in use in the United States. It is conservatively estimated that as much more can be developed by utilization of the water power resources. The Department of the Interior has placed the potential water power at 60,000,000 horsepower, of which but 10,000,000 is now developed. This saves the country upward of 33,-000,000 tons of coal annually.

Big Wealth in Hands of Few

Fifty Families in United States facts on the pyramiding of American Control More Than \$100,-000,000 Each.

ROCKEFELLER AT HEAD OF LIST

Oil King's Estate Is Now Estimated at Between Three and Five Billion-Veritable Dynasty in Every Important Industry.

New York .- Fifty families in the United States control over \$100,000,000 each, 100 families control over \$50,-

John D. Rockefeller's estate is now up to \$3,000,000,000.

Five billion dollars of wealth in the United States has been handed down to heirs, many of whom were incompetents, in the last fifteen years.

Two hundred persons in the United Harriman ... States control \$15,000,000,000; in France the same amount is controlled by 480 times that number of people, Gould estate

Mr. Klein's attention was called to the recent statement of George P. Hampton, managing director of the Farmers' National council, that 33 individuals own 2 per cent of the entire American wealth. He estimated this 2 per cent at about \$4,837,000,-000. Mr. Hampton gave no names, but the following list of individuals and estates and their vast holdings; checked up to a recent date, was given by Mr. Klein:

This year, however, it is proposed to plant American or Egyptian cotton. So happy have the results at the experimental station been, that it is hoped that soon work may be begun for the total reclaiming of the whole of the "campagna."

HARD TO EXPLAIN POISONING

Scientists Unable to Tell Why Bites of Some Animals Are Fatal and Others Innocuous.

Scientists in Great Britain have been greatly interested in the recent case of a monkey bite resulting in the death of the king of Greece, says a London dispatch. The result is that a study is being made of the effects of bites from various animals. Inasmuch. as the monkey is what is known as a "clean feeder," it seems extraordinary that the bite of such an animal should produce the fatal poisoning of a human being.

It does not, however, appear that the malignancy of an animal's bite can be measured by what it feeds upon. A dog is a carnivorous creature, yet its bite seldom produces serious results, while on the other aand the bite of a horse or a donkey frequently results in poisoning. · Only a few weeks ago a woman died from being bitten by a donkey, while a man lost a hand through being nipped on the thumb by a horse.
