#### A Chance To Secure Black Walnut Seedlings.

The Centre County Conservation Association has received from the State Forestry Department at Harrisburg 3000 seedlings of the Black Walnut tree. The black walnut tree requires a moist, rich soil for best development. It should be planted on the bottom land along streams in open spots for black walnut will not grow in the shade.
