NOVEMBER 10, 1886.

John Decker and one of his sons killed two deer in the Seven mountains a few days ago.

Mr. Deining informs us that he had a customer for two lots upon which two houses would be built by the intended purchaser, but the sale and building of said houses is stopped because the council has thus far foolishly refused to establish a street line, which leaves parties desiring to make improvements, in the dark as to where to make the proper locations.

ROBS OTHER BIRDS OF PREY

"Frigate Pelican" Secures Its Food Chiefly by Forcing Its Weaker Brethren to Disgorge.

The frigate bird, also called the man-of-war hawk and the "frigate pelican," is a sea bird, so called from its attacks on other birds. This bird, very large and with black plumage, is capable of very powerful and rapid flight. It sometimes measures ten feet from tip to tip of its extended wings. On account of its immense extent of wing and its dashing habits, it has been called the swiftest bird that sweeps the seas.

The frigate bird is a tropical sea bird of two species. The larger ranges all round the world within the tropics; the smaller is found only near the eastern seas from Madagascar to Moluccas and southward to Australia. Both species breed in large colonies, building their nests on rocks, high cliffs or lofty trees on uninhabited islands. The birds often fly far out to sea, but most of the time they remain near shore.

The frigate bird's aerial evolutions are extremely graceful and it soars to great heights. It is said never to dive for its prey, but to seize fishes only when they appear at the surface or above it. Flying fishes form a great part of its food. This bird of prey also pursues gulls and terns and eats the fish it forces them to disgorge. The male acquires under its bill a bright scarlet pouch which is capable of inflation.

Many Raise Peppermint.

Peppermint probably occupies one of the most honorable places on the list of drug plants, for the distillation of oil from its leaves is an important industry to which thousands of acres are devoted, principally in Michigan and New York. Their oils are extracted also from wintergreen, pennyroyal, tansy and a number of other well-known plants. To be salable the leaves must be dried in a place where there is plenty of air but no dampness, and in the shade, for this keeps the bright color. They must be looked over with care that no other leaves are mixed with them and packed in boxes or barrels to be shipped. Bulletins on this subject may be obtained from the superintendent of documents, Washington, D. C., at a cost of 15 cents apiece. Uncle Sam warns us that there are risks in these crops as well as in others, but all enterprises are risks in this uncertain world.

Make Gas From Straw.

A Canadian inventor has worked out a new application of thrift in the form of a gas which can be made from straw. The invention will be of special value in farm communities, as it will enable the farmers to utilize straw that now goes to waste. The gas is made in a three-cylinder retort. Each cylinder holds a bale of straw seven feet long, two feet wide and six inches thick. With the chambers closed the straw is ignited and allowed to burn from 30 to 40 minutes. It is said that 12,000 cubic feet of gas can be generated from a ton of straw, in addition to which there will be by-products of six to eight gallons of tar and 60 pounds of carbon from which lamp black can be obtained.

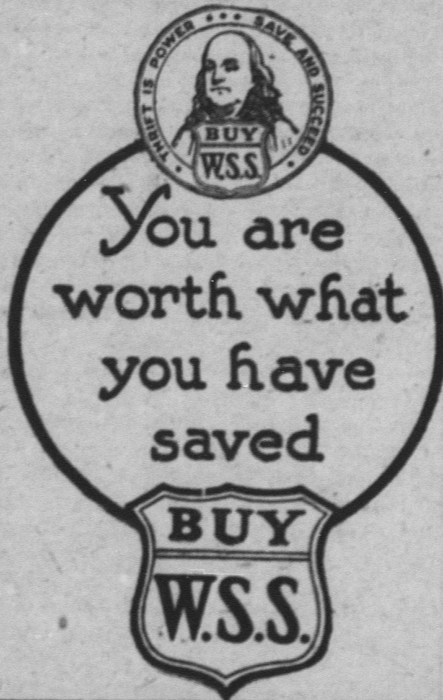

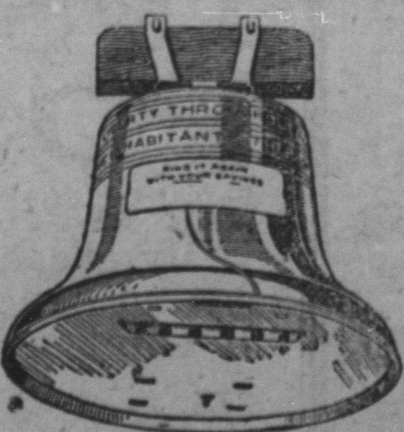

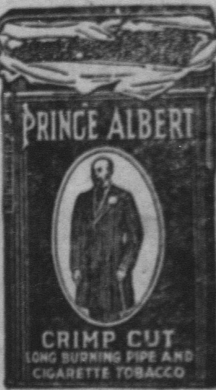
