Paragraphs of News Taken from the Files of the Reporter of 1887. AUGUST 3, 1887.

The corn crop in our valley will be only three-fourths of a full crop.

Mrs. J. S. Houseman, of Tusseyville, is quite ill, from an affection of the heart.

John Grove, one of the well known citizens of Gregg, is announced for associate judge.

Sheriff Spangler returned with a fine drove of cattle on Saturday, brought in from the western part of the state.

The new houses—Dauberman's, Flory's, Lee's and Kurtz's, all in the direction of the station, are fast approaching completion.

A new family has been added to Centre Hall, with the arrival of Mr. Fenstermaker, wife and three daughters, from Pittston, and formerly of Illinois.

Mr. Fenstermaker will take charge of the roller mill in this place, as miller. There came near being a serious railroad accident near Lemont, on Monday afternoon, as the 2 p. m. train came along.

A team was on the crossing and in the spring wagon were two gentlemen and woman and child. The whistle was blown and the horse began to plunge, and cleared the track.

Mr. Blair jumped from the wagon, and alighting on his head, was picked up unconscious, but was soon restored.

Mrs. David Stuart died at her home in Boalsburg, on Thursday, 21st. Her age was seventy-five years.

Mrs. Green Decker, of Georges Valley, died on Friday. She leaves a husband and eleven children. Interment took place on Sunday at Sprucetown.

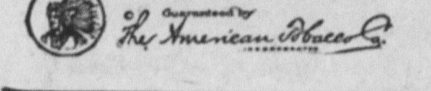

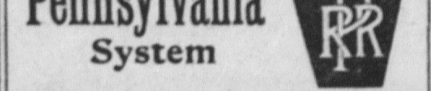

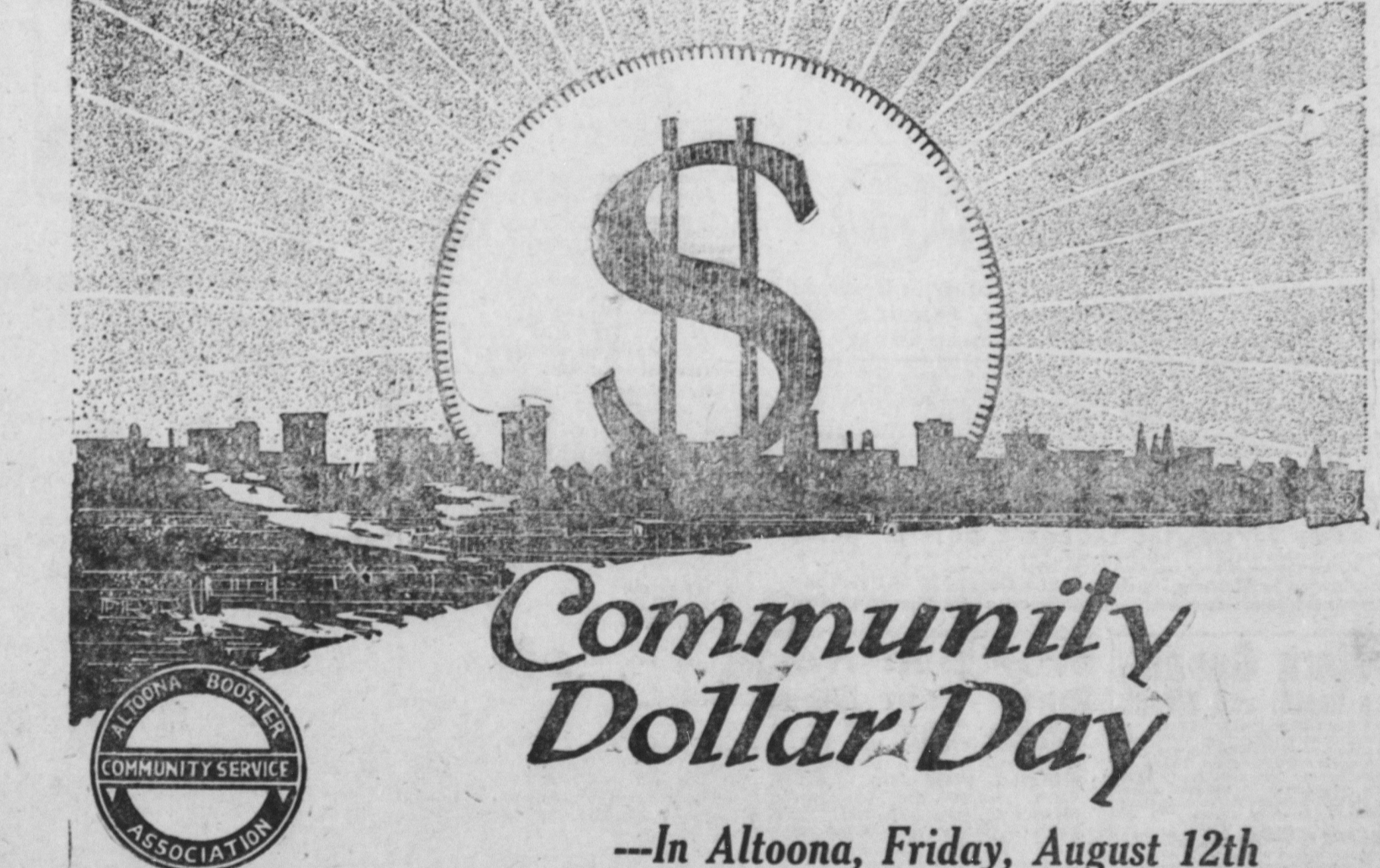
