THIRTY-FOUR YEARS AGO

Paragraphs of News Taken from the Files of the Reporter of 1887.

AUGUST 10, 1887.

Mrs. McClintic, living with her son-in-law, Felix Burkholder, at Centre Hill, is seriously ill with pneumonia. The lady a short time ago, broke a limb by a fall outdoors, which renders her condition all the more critical.

The fishing party from this place to Paddy mountain tunnel caught about 300 suckers and 30 eels, all of which were of good size and caught only after hard work. Frank Bradford did all he could to make it pleasant for the boys.

Stephen Garrity, of the Seven Mountains, died on Tuesday morning at his home, aged 82 years. Mr. Garrity was an honored old Irishman who lived on the Garrity homestead in the mountains a great many years. He was genial and

kind-hearted, and loved company, although never much inclined to go away from home. Mrs. Garrity died 'about a year ago. Mr. Garrity's remains were interred in the Catholic cemetery at Bellefonte. He leaves a son, Patrick, and a daughter, Mrs. M'Cafray, of Bellefonte.
