





ers' Bulletin 1168, Varieties of Winter Wheat, Adapted to the Eastern United States, which charts localities in which various types of wheat can be grown to advantage, and lists the varieties adapted to each particular locality.

The bulletin suggests that there is a large local demand in New England for wheat as a poultry or stock feed, and it should not be difficult for several farmers in almost every neighborhood to sell all the wheat they can raise at a good price to their neighbors. Winter wheat will doubtless produce better average yields, where

it can be grown, than spring wheat, if proper cultural methods and suitable varieties are used. Improve Wheat Yield.

in other desirable characteristics by the selection of good heads or good plants from the general field and growing the seed from each individual head or plant in separate rows. Continued selection will result in constantly improved seed. Another method of purifying a variety and increasing the yield is what may be called mass selection. This consists simply in picking out good heads from the field at large, sowing the selected seed in a small area, and reselecting it the next harvest time. The bulletin may be had on application.

FARM CHIMNEYS NEED STUDY They Should Start From Ground and

Not Be Placed on Brackets-Make Foundation Solid.

All chimneys for farm buildings should start from the ground. Those tion." placed on brackets are unsafe and often increase the rate of insurance. In a properly designed house of moderate size, one or at most two chimneys, each containing several flues,

will serve every purpose. If possible, flue should be provided for each stove, as much better drafts are thereby obtained, say specialists of the United States Department of Agriculture.

The chimney should have a solid foundation of brick or stone, and if of brick, of course, an extra footing should be laid. The exterior walls should be two bricks thick and the division walls one brick thick. In case the chimney is lined with one

of the patent fire-clay linings now on Wheat can be improved in yield and the market one brick will prove of sufficient thickness for the exterior walls.

In case it is necessary to carry a stovepipe any considerable distance inside a partition to reach the chimney, a terra cotta thimble should be used, and where a pipe passes completely through a partition it should be protected with a ventilated thimble




