Gasoline Tax After Sept. 1.

The Legislature at the last session imposed a tax of 1 cent per gallon on gasoline and preparations are now being made by the Auditor General's office for its collection, as it becomes effective on Sept. 1.

Inquiries have been made regarding this tax, but as it is not a government tax inquiries should be directed to the office of Auditor General Samuel S. Lewis at Harrisburg.

Dealers will be required to keep a record of all sales and blanks for the purpose will be furnished by the Auditor General. The tax is intended for the consumer, so that there will be no tax on the product when it is sold for the purpose of reselling.

Reports from Washington are to the effect that Congress is considering imposing a tax on all automobiles.

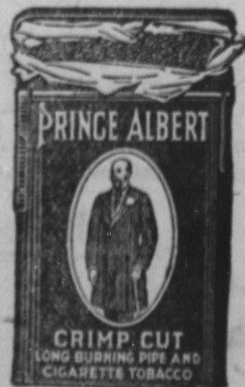
