OCTOBER 13, 1887.

Luther B. Stover has opened a store at Madisonburg.

Carpenters are busy working out stiff for the new Presbyterian church. The joists are now on the walls.

New sawmills are still being planted in the mountains along Penns Creek. Woodman, spare that tree.

Rev. Fischer, on invitation, will preach a sermon in one of the Baltimore Lutheran churches, as a supply. Hope they won't give him a call.

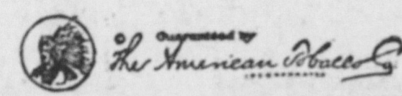
