Bonded Tobacco Warehouse.

Pennsylvania is to have one of the first tobacco warehouses bonded under the U. S. warehouse act. Plans have been developed by the Mt. Joy Farm Products' Company, Mt. Joy, Lancaster county, to accept tobacco from growers in Lancaster county, sweat and pack it for them and to sell it on the instructions of the growers at a time satisfactory to them. While the tobacco is in the possession of the Mt. Joy company arangements have been made so that advances of 10 cents per pound can be secured from the bankers interested in the proposition. A charge of 2 cents per pound will be made by the company for packing cases and other incidental expenses.

Veteran Editor Dies.

Calvin William Gutelius, a native of Mifflinburg and a member of a famous ploneer family, which, according to tradition, was founded by a high caste Frenchman who was banished from France by royal edict for marrying out of his station, died a few days ago at his home in Northumberland at the

age of eighty-four years. He had been active in founding Democratic newspapers throughout Cenral Pennsylvania, working as a journalist at Bellefonte, Sunbury and other places prior to 1872, when he established the Public Press at Northumberland which was published continuously until 1917. He had been ill for some time. His widow and eight sons and daughters survive him
