Good Roads to Bear Meadows.

District Forester Morton has notified the Department of Forestry that he has resumed the construction of the new road through the Bear Meadows. Construction of this road was begun last fall.

The grade is now completed for virtually the entire length, and a bridge has been built over Sinking Creek. The road bed through the Meadows proper has been well piked with stone. Forester Morton expects to use new road building machinery to finish the grading just as soon as the frost is entirely out of the ground. He expects to finish the job by July 1.
