BIG TIME AT BOALSBURG.

Notes from the Centre County Conservation Association.

In conection with the meeting to be held at Boalsburg on June 22, there wll be held a County Fly Casting Con-

The contest will be open to all residents of Centre county. If over eighteen years of age contestants must be members of the Centre County Conservation Association. Dr. W. R. Ham, Boalsburg, Pa., will have charge of the contests which will be held on the grounds of the Boal Machine Gun Troop. He will appoint the necessary captains and assistants.

FLY CASTING CONTESTS .- Tackle: Regulation fly, reel, and dry fly. Line unrestricted, but must not be knotted or weighted. Leader must be of single gut and not less than 6 feet long. Single handed, overhead casting. One white fly only shall be used, not larger than No. 10, with hook broken at the bend.

DISTANCE FLY CONTESTS .- The contest shall be on the water. Casts shall be made parallel with a running board for accurate measuring. Each contestant shall be allowed 10 minutes to cast for distance. Should any contestant whip off a fly he shall replace it at once with another. No time allowed for replacing flies or other accidents.

SCORING.-The score shall be based on an average of 5 casts. The contestant making the highest average will be declared the winner of the contest and be awarded a prize. The longest single cast of each contestant shall be made a matter of record. World's record-H. C. Golcher, 1915; 116 feet.

ACCURACY FLY CONTEST, unknown distances.-There shall be five 30-inch rings, anchored in a line from 20 to 50 feet from the castingplatform Ten casts are to be made as follows: One at each target and change to the next until the fifth is reached. Ther in reversed order back to the first Caster may make as many false casts in extending his line to the first ring and between targets as he desires. When the contestant is ready to cast at a target he shall call "score" and the next cast thereafter shall be counted. Each contestant shall be allowed ten minutes.

Should contestant whip off fly after calling score he shall at once replace fly and "work out" to point where fly was lost, call "score" and proceed. The same proceedure will be permitted if contestant's line is fouled. The line for length not exceeding 5 feet may be looped from the reel and held in the hand. Caster must not let his fly or line drag in along the water before returning.

SCORING.-If the fly falls within the ring or on the rim of the same, the score shall be zero. For each foot or fraction of a foot outside the ring a demerit of one shall be made. The sum total of demerits divided by the total number of casts shall constitute the demerit percent. The demerit percent deducted from 100 shall be the percentage. The contestant making the highest percentage shall be declared the winner of the contest. A prize wi'l

World Sees the Dawn of Universal Democracy.

With the Downfall of the Turk and the Hun Santa Sophia Will Be Restored as a Christian Temple.

Among the happy rejoicings of these victory days we are inexpressibly glad that the war did not end until the unspeakable Turk was well started down the toboggan of defeat toward the bottomless pit, writes Dr. Charles Edward Locke. It is a mighty trlumph for democracy. With Jerusalem and Damascus In the hands of the Christians, and with Constantinople no longer desecrated as the capital of a filthy Mohammedanism, the foul Turk is now getting his long-delayed deserts. Constantinople was named for a zealous Christian prince. It was made the imposing headquarters of the Greek church, and a beautiful temple was built in the year 537 by Justinian which is so stately and gorgeous that this proud builder on the dedication day exclaimed: "O Solomon, I have surpassed thee!"

But in 1453 the city was captured by the sacrilegeous and infidel Saracen, and for 465 years it has been the center of Moslem worship and propaganda. It is beautifully situated on the western slopes of the Bosporous, and looks out upon the picturesque Marmora. Justinian's min-Ister grand was transformed into a Moslem mosque. All the altars and crosses and frescoes and insignia of Christianity were ruthlessly removed. and for nearly five centuries, instead of the worship of the most high God resounding beneath a wonderful dome which Michael Angelo said was like a part of the heavens brought down to earth, it has been the scene of Mohammedan mummeries and semi-pagan

With the victories of this war, no doubt magnificent Santa Sophia will be restored, and once again the praises of Christ will resound through sanctuary and clolster; and the marvelous fresco of Jesus and his disciples in the high dome, which for centuries has been concealed behind the incrustations of a detestable Moslemism, will once again utter its inspiring and artistic messages to reverent Christian worshipers. The overthrow of the Turk is not only a triumph of democracy, but it is likewise a mighty victory for the truth and justice which are interpreted to the world by the gospel of the Son of God and the Son of Man, Jesus Christ of Nazareth.

Until the savage Prussian Hun appeared the Turk had conferred upon him the ignominy of being the most brutal degenerate of all humar. history. A religion of lust, re-enforced by the bloody scimiter, the Turk cui his way through human bodies to ar ignoble place of power in Europe and Asia and his murderous hate venting itself on the defenseless Christians, and especially, upon the innocent Arme

With the collapse of the Turkish government, "the Dardanelles will be come a highway for the commerce of the free nations of the world, in place of a waterway held by pirates;" the Balkan terror comes to an end, and the ignoble crescent fades out of sight before the increasing effulgence of the blazing cross of the Christ of truth and freedom.

The years have waited long for the tremendous historic events which are now being enacted in bewildering suc cession. It was only yesterday that there were four powerful autocracies that seemed so intrenched in opulence and might that the centuries would not overthrow; but today, Russia, and Austria, and Turkey, and Germany have all fallen, and great has been the fall thereof; the twilight of the kings has deepened into night, and the dawn of universal democracy is al ready reddening the eastern sky with premonitions of the new day of the people; and the harbingers of the morning are shouting on all hilltops and in all languages, "Proclaim liberty throughout all the land and to all the inhabitants thereof."
