**DO YOU BELIEVE IT?**

Could anything be more ridiculous! Think of it, voters, the Republican would have you believe that state appropriations are dealt out to favorites. Are the Democrats of Centre county not citizens of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania? Since when is it necessary, in order to secure an appropriation for Pennsylvania State College, the Bellefonte hospital, and other public institutions, to send members of a particular party to Harrisburg. You might hear such a thought as is expressed by the Republican in an asylum but you ought not to hear it elsewhere.

What "results" have these men had in the past? They have both before filled the offices to which they aspire. The result is this: The Bellefonte hospital is in worse condition today as to finances than it has ever been in its history. Pennsylvania State College is begging for money in every county in the state. Every organization, except (perhaps) the undertakers, have been boned to make contributions for its support so it can decently exist. Why, the co-eds are on their knees blacking shoes to help out. That's how these super-legislators have gotten appropriations.

What did these super-men get in the way of roads in Penns Valley? Quietly, now, what do you think of the state road leading from Boalsburg to Potters Mills? That is a sample of what Republican legislators get us. That road was "got" by a Republican. It's a pippen.

It's things about home that count. How much of an appropriation did Penns Valley get for snow shoveling? Not a cent, while other state roads were kept open on the Millin county side to the Centre county line, but not a dollar was spent to open the road in Centre county.

The real reasons Democrats are not wanted in the next Legislature is because the election of McSparran is feared. The Republicans want to maintain the large majority in both bodies, thinking that by so doing they can cover up the dirty mess.

**INSURANCE ADJUSTED.**

From information gathered from various sources the figures given below almost accurately indicate the amount of insurance that will be paid Merchant C. M. Smith for the fire loss on merchandise and the order of Odd Fellows for the damage to the building occasioned by the fire early Sunday morning, 22nd ult.

As was stated in last week's issue of the Reporter, Mr. Smith carried insurance on merchandise valued at from \$25,000 to \$30,000 on the eighty per cent co-insurance plan. It appears settlement was made by the insurance companies agreeing to pay \$15,000, and Mr. Smith to retain the damaged goods, which are reckoned to be less than fifty per cent damaged. W. S. Shelton, of Millheim, was the agent who insured the merchandise. On making inquiry of Mr. Shelton as to the adjustment of the loss, the Reporter's representative was informed that he would not make a statement. Mr. Smith was not consulted for the reason that it was believed he too would not care to give figures.

In the case of the loss on the building of the Odd Fellows and the insurance company have not yet agreed. The policy face is \$7,000, written on the co-insurance plan. On the lodge equipment, a policy of \$400, will likely be paid out in full.
