### CAREFULLY PACK EGGS FOR TRADE

Much of Big Annual Loss Can Be Prevented If Little Precaution Is Observed.

#### RETAIL SECOND-HAND CASES

Good Stiff Fillers Should Be Used With Sufficient Packing at Top and Bottom and Between Layers to Prevent Breaking.

Tremendous losses occur annually due to the breakage of eggs on their way to market. Much of this loss can be prevented if the eggs are packed more carefully before they are shipped.

If the poultryman uses a second-hand case, it is necessary to retail it, no matter how good and sound it may appear. Any loose pieces should be made solid and the bottom securely nailed. By the driving of a few nails the crate is put in perfect condition.

Use Stiff Fillers. After the crate is ready the fillers should be inspected, and only good stiff fillers used, with sufficient packing at bottom, top and between layers of eggs to prevent jarring and break-

The best materials to use in packing eggs are especially prepared excelsior pads, which consist of sheets of excelsior about half-inch thick wrapped in thin paper which holds the excelsior in place, and makes it an efficient packing material.

The poultry department of the New Jersey Agricultural experiment station has tried the following method of packing market eggs with such good results that it can be highly recommended. First, place an excelsior pad in the bottom of each compartment of the crate. Directly upon this pad place a filler and fill with eggs as usual, packing the eggs with the small end down. If no flat is placed over the pads, the eggs will bed themselves in the excelsior and ride safely. Three layers should be packed as usual, alternately flat and filler, with an excelsior pad instead of a flat on top of the third layer. Continue to fill the crate, using filler, flat and filler. On the top use an excelsior pad with no flat. This method leaves only one layer, the second from the bottom, without a cushion directly above and below it and holds the contents firmly in place.

#### Nail Cover at Ends.

Nail the cover at the ends. Never nail an egg cover in the center. Pack so that when the cover is nailed down at the ends there will be a bulge in the center. This means pressure enough to hold the contents from jarring and breaking. It means a natural cushioning of the eggs in the excelsior with which they come in contact, thus giving the entire contents a springiness which insures safe transportation.

#### VALUE OF ORDINARY SILAGE

Ton Is Equivalent to About Four Bushels of Corn Plus Tenth of Ton of Good Hay.

One rough and ready rule which is not very far wrong with ordinary silage under conditions as they now prevail, is to figure that it has a value per ton equivalent to about four bushels of corn plus one-tenth of a ton of good quality hay. Still another rule which applies fairly well with ordinary silage yielding ten tons per acre, and made out of corn running fifty bushels per acre, is to figure that a ton has a value equivalent to five bushels of corn plus \$1.20. Using this latter rule and figuring corn at 50 cents a bushel, we find that silage would be given a value of \$3.70 a ton.

#### SYMMETRICAL HEAD OF TREE

In Pruning Aim to Remove Superfluous Shoots to Prevent Any Waste of Vitality.

The pruning of fruit trees is to accomplish four things. It should be done in such a manner that there is an even flow of sap to all parts. Superfluous shoots should be removed to prevent a waste of vitality in supplying such shoots with sap. Fruit bearing is stimulated, but care must be taken that this stimulation is not overdone. The fourth object is to keep the head of the tree symmetrical.

### VEGETABLE GARDENS OF BIG IMPORTANCE

Home Table Not Supplied With Pleasing Variety.

Condition Resulted From Shortage of Labor and From Erroneous Idea of Some Short-Sighted Farmers That It Don't Pay.

(Prepared by the United States Department of Agriculture.)

There has been a marked tendency on the part of farmers recently to neglect their vegetable gardens and as a result the home table has not been so well supplied with a variety of food as formerly, says the United States Department of Agriculture. This condition has resulted partially from a shortage of farm labor, but more particularly from an idea that has crept into the minds of farmers that the garden does not pay. There is no basis for the argument that the farm crops take all the time and there is no opportunity to work a garden because production of many farm crops is now overdone and there is little sale for the surplus. Potatoes and cabbage were very plentiful during the latter part of 1922, but potatoes and cabbage are largely a farm crop and have been produced in excess of the demand.

The significant point in the whole matter is that the farmer's purchasing power has from various causes been curtailed and he needs to produce more and more of his own living and depend less upon the grocery store and the meat market. Years ago every farm home had its full supply of home-cured meats, canned tomatoes, dried beans and dried corn, fresh ground meal from selected home-grown corn, and an abundance of fruits and vegetables both in summer and winter. Today many farmers seem to be so busy growing crops to feed the world that they neglect their own home table. Make the 1923 home vegetable garden worth while, and thereby both increase the family living and reserve its income for other uses.

#### DEVICE TO RESTRAIN SWINE

Apparatus Securely Holds Animals to Be Operated Upon—May Be Readily Adjusted.

The Scientific American in illustrating and describing a device for restraining pigs, the invention of G. Cortez of Los Angeles, Cal., says:

The invention relates to a restraining apparatus and operating table especially adapted for use in connection with pigs. An object is to provide a restraining or holding appa-

ratus which may be employed for safely holding a pig while being operated upon. The device may be readily adjusted for use in connection with pigs of various sizes, and may be operated entirely by one man, the operator having free access to the animal.

#### PREPARE FOR EARLY SPRAYS

Lime-Sulphur May Be Applied to Apple Trees for Oyster Shell and San Jose Scale.

There are a few fruit diseases and insects that may be sprayed for the latter part of February or the first of March. Lime-sulphur spray may be applied to apple trees for oyster shell and San Jose scale. This same spray should be applied to peaches before April first to check leaf curl and fruit rot.

Bordeaux mixture and arsenate of lead is used on apple trees just before the leaves appear and later, just before the blossoms open. These sprays are to control bud moths, tent caterpillars, canker worms and other eating insects. The spray just before the blossoms appear is the most important to control scab in apples and pears.

Before the blossoms on cherry trees open, the trees should be sprayed with bordeaux mixture for fruit rot. At the same stage, plums should be sprayed with bordeaux mixture and arsenate of lead for curculio and fruit rot. Grapes should be sprayed before growth starts with bordeaux mixture for grape rot.

#### POTATO GROWERS HARD HIT

Plan to Decrease Acreage, Increase Storage Facilities and Seek New Markets.

Potato growers in the Middle West lost money on their crop last year and are planning to make a few changes that will help to avoid this condition. Michigan, Kansas, North Dakota, Nebraska and Minnesota raised approximately 100,000,000 bushels. Decreasing the acreage, increasing storage facilities, searching for new markets, and working out better marketing plans are ways now being considered by those growers who lost money on the last potato crop.




