In another column of this issue appears a bit of information on the funds need for school purposes thruout the state during the period covered for which the present legislature will make appropriation of funds. The figures are given by Auditor General Lewis and are based on the reports of the school districts in the state, which no doubt gives the true situation. It appears that neither the governor, his commissioners nor Finegan know as much about the state school finances as they think they do, or ought to know. The Auditor General's estimate is \$29,270,984 more that that of the Governor's, and \$10,670,984 more than that of State Sucrintendent Finegan. If the other estimates of the Governor's are as far off the mark as is his estimate for the school needs-good night!
