**Prisoners Hear Concert.**

Prisoners at the Rockview branch of the Western Penitentiary were given a treat recently when the Pennsylvania State College military band rendered a Sunday afternoon concert program for their benefit. Rockview is only eight miles from the college and the concert was given in response to a request from prison officials.

**High School Day at Penn State May 12**

The annual celebration of High School Day at State College will take place on May 12 this year and will be featured as usual by the annual inter-scholastic track and field meet for the J. G. White Trophy Cup. More than twenty-three schools of the state have already entered teams in the meet and it is expected that over 300 school-boy athletes will take part in the day's program, and also take occasion to inspect the college. The track events will start in the morning and the finals will be run off in the afternoon. Cups and medals will be presented to winners by the Penn State athletic authorities. Harrisburg Tech took first honors in last year's meet and will again be represented by a strong team.

**After Mountain Fire Burns.**

Jacob Lamy, of Woodward, in Penns Valley, is in jail in Bellefonte, in default of \$1000 bail on a charge of starting a forest fire with the intention of securing employment in fighting the fire.

The arrest was made by state police who put bloodhounds on the trail after a fire was started in the Seven Mountain region. There have been a number of fires in that vicinity and the state police were called to make an investigation. Lamy, who is fifty years of age, was unable to furnish bail when arraigned before Justice of the Peace Musser, on Saturday.

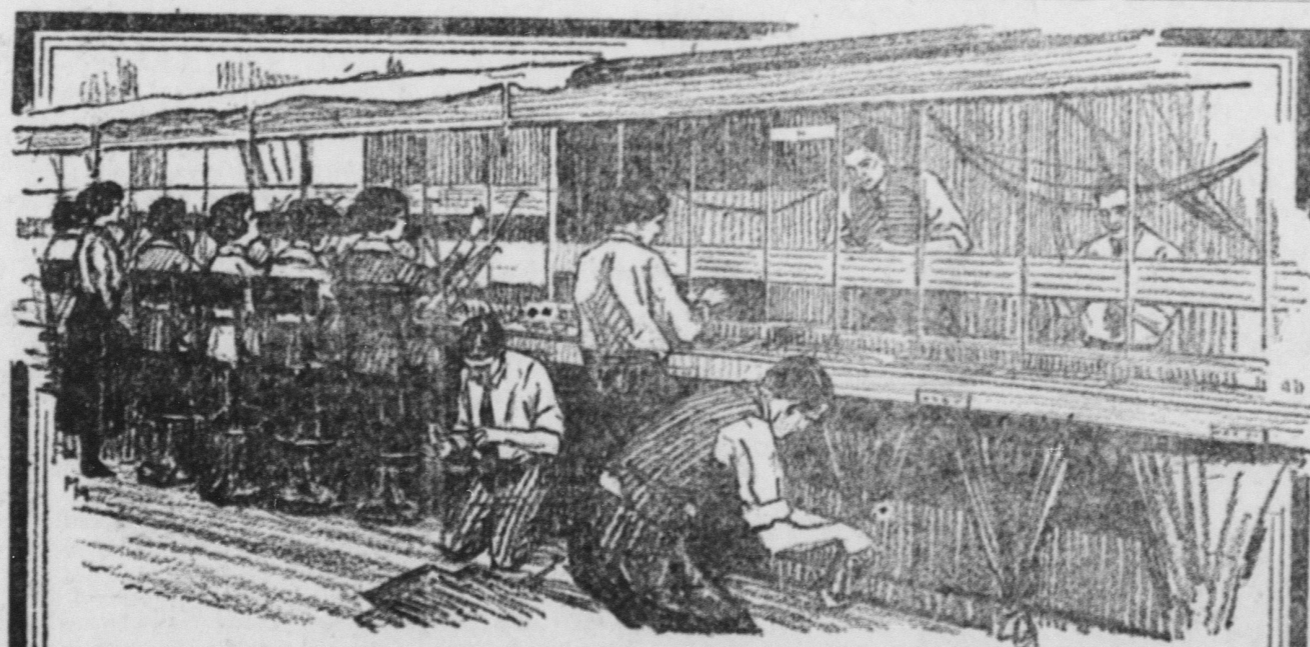

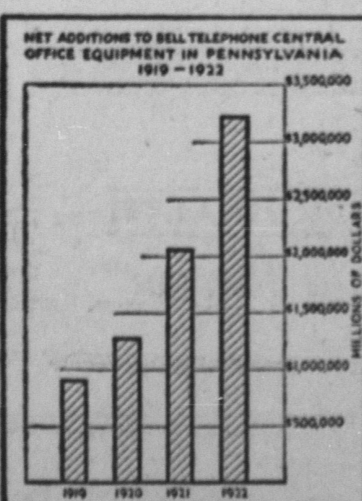
