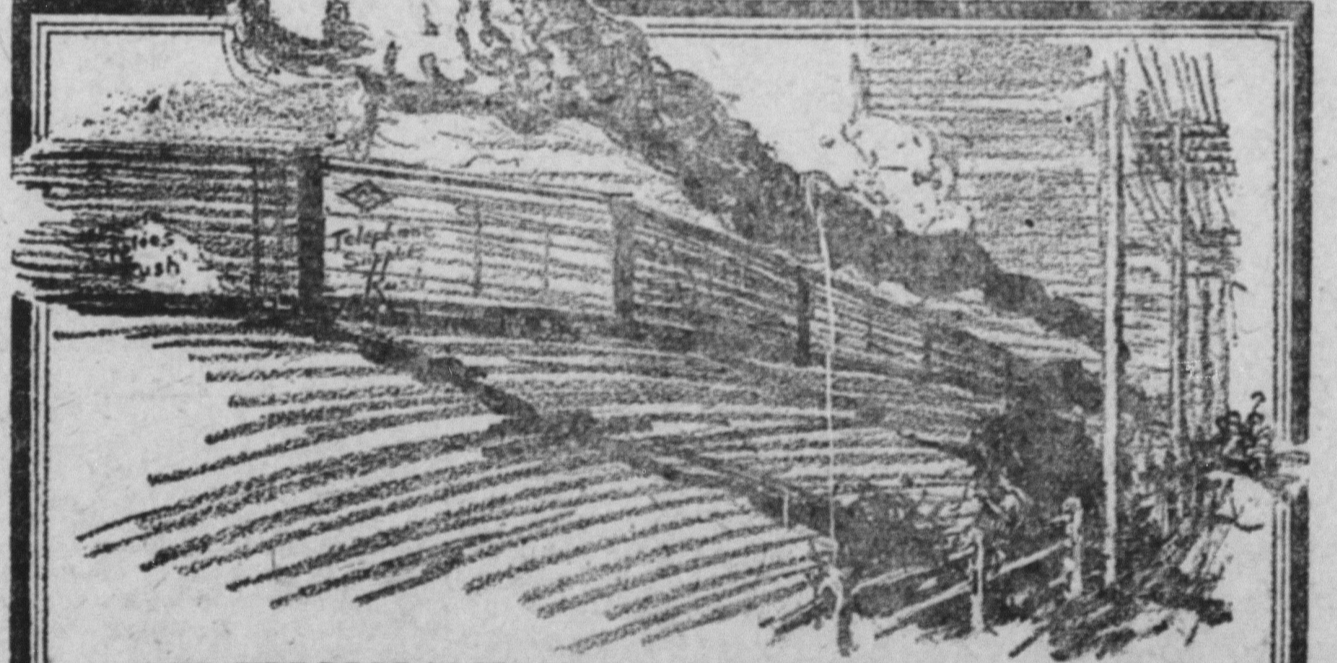

To accomplish the work, three cars loaded with telephone equipment must leave the factories for every hour of working time throughout the year.


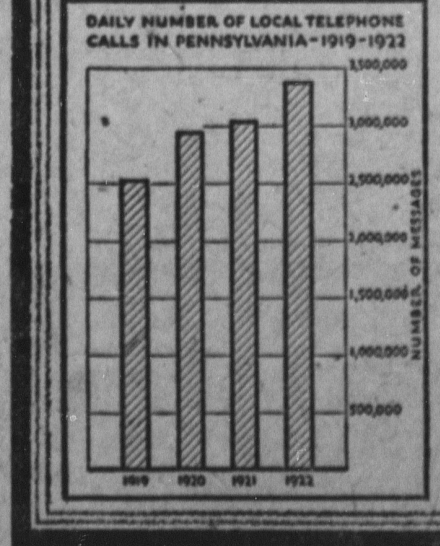
