

In France the name is Catherine. Catherina, Caton and Trinette. In Spain, we have Catalina. Catarina is Italian, and Katherine, Katchen, Kathe and Trina are Teutonic. Katinka is Russian, and Katrina and Koline are Swedish. The Slovak adaptation is Katrina.


